Fr. Terry's Column

It's been a while, so now is a good opportunity for an update on construction for our Phase II of church renovations. All our generous gifts to the Lead with Beauty capital campaign continue to show great promise as we get closer to returning to a full(er) place of worship. While many may be looking forward to a great set of restrooms close by, I am excited about the big interior space where people can enjoy each other's company before and after Mass. I miss seeing so many people hanging out after Mass in the gathering space. So that's my biggest thing, although there are many others, that I look forward to. A close second might be the organ!

After a few weeks of stalled progress on the steel due to alignment issues (now resolved!), the steel is almost completely erected. The decking for the second floor has been installed, which is why it looks a lot darker from the looking glass we have by our eastern church entrance. This week we should have the cement poured for that second floor, and soon after that the stars will be installed. The stairs for accessing the second floor (two sets) are mostly pre-fabricated off-site, so their appearance will be quick and hopefully problem-free, although it should be pretty impressive to see them moved into place. Then we will see interior framing begin as soon as it is safe to work down below with everything overhead mostly finished. As the worker bees get busy inside, a masonry team will begin laying bricks on the outside. This will take months, as they slowly but surely rise higher and higher to the roof line.

One of the biggest things we will be awaiting for a while is the steeple. That will go above the steel you see, arriving in one piece and installing in a day or two, but it will be some time before we get there, as it needs to be

made still. Another important piece by a special fabricator is the rose window, which you can see will go below our bell tower area inside the big square on the front of our façade. Below the window (right above the future doors) will be a beautiful limestone figure of Christ Jesus, exposing His Sacred Heart and raising His hand in blessing. Beneath Him will read the words "Come Unto to me all" in Latin (Venite Ad Me Omnes). These are the words on the statue of the Sacred Heart at Notre Dame, just in the center of the quad in front of the golden dome. It is a fitting and timeless summons that goes back to the earliest Catholic presence in our diocese, up at Notre Dame in South Bend. We are working with multiple other vendors for special items such as the bell system (electronic but capable of amazingly authentic sound), the baptismal font, and the beautification of our Divine Mercy Chapel, where we anxiously await to return Eucharistic Adoration from our more humble temporary chapel. We are also in the process of shopping for a new tabernacle for church, which will take time because we have many considerations to balance: size, cost, shape, design, fitting with the space.

We are still going to wait a long while. Hopefully Thanksgiving will be the time when we are "complete" enough to use everything, even if a couple other things have to be worked on (including the organ getting reared and ready to go for Christmas).

I will try to record a new video soon to give you a better sense of the visuals of where things will be in the new narthex (gathering space) which will also house the baptismal font. When it comes out, please share it with your families and fellow parishioners so all get a chance to see it.

Indiana School Choice Scholarship

WHAT IS A CHOICE SCHOLARSHIP? A Choice Scholarship is a State of Indiana Department of Education funded scholarship, one per student, that helps reduce the cost of tuition at a non-public school. Scholarship awards are sent directly to the non-public school and applied to the student's tuition balance.

Beginning July 1, 2026, the School Choice Scholarship program will become universal. This means income guidelines will no longer apply, and all K-8 students will be eligible to receive the scholarship!

To qualify for the School Choice Scholarship, families must provide proof of residency. Acceptable documents include:

- Utility bill (electric, gas, or water) within the last 90 days
- Lease Agreement or mortgage statement
- Property tax statement
- Other official mailing showing your name and Indiana address

HOW MUCH WILL I RECEIVE TOWARD TUITION FROM THE CHOICE SCHOLARSHIP?

Choice Scholarship award amounts are based on the public-school corporation in which the student resides. Below you will find the estimated scholarship award amounts for the 2026-2027 school year.

- **Fort Wayne Community Schools \$7,219.83**
- **Huntington County Community School \$6,750.72**
- **East Allen County Schools \$7,023.57**
