In 2022-2023, our parish began the process for a two-phase renovation of the church. Construction had not begun by 6-30-2023, but plans were drawn up and presented to the parish through initial renderings done by Design Collaborative. Construction began in July 2023. For the 2022-2023 school year, the Diocese changed the tuition structure for all the schools resulting in higher tuition rates for our families. The state program, School Choice, was expanded and our school gained over 40 new students even with the mandated tuition increase. Our youth programs grew in size and a co-ed high school group was added, HIGH SEAS. Fidelis and Fraternus each averaged more than 100 people weekly. The Little Flowers program doubled in size to more than 40 1st-5th grade girls. Our Family Formation got a new program to dive deeper into the faith as a family. Our Sacramental Formation classes continue to be very strong. The Bible Study and Small Faith Groups are continuing to keep meeting and growing in their faith. We also welcomed back an old program under a new name, "Welcome", formally known as CRHP. Welcome had strong men's and women's weekends in the fall. SetonFest returned as well and even though we had some rain, much fun was had by all.

Our parishioners are making a positive impact on each other and in the world.
