# 3 year old program



Our 3 year old program establishes an educational foundation for our students. This is accomplished through routines, age appropriate center play, and in-class learning experiences. Students explore their world through different centers: dramatic play, creative art, math, science, religion, and drawing. These centers allow the students to begin the connection between letters, sounds, and words. The students begin to understand how to quantify, sort, identify shapes and patterns, and compare objects. Students learn about Jesus, the Holy Family, and how to be kind and empathetic. They begin to recognize emotions and are guided to express those emotions constructively. Three year olds practice fine motor skills in the classroom through art and playdough while large motor skills are worked on in outdoor recess.

**Children entering our 3 year old program must be 3 years old by October 1 of the year they enter the program. All students need to be completely independent in the restroom by the first day of school.**

Our 3 year old program runs two days a week from 8:00 to 11:00 AM on Tuesdays and Thursdays. **Early drop-off is NOT available.** The class of 18 students is taught by a teacher with additional teaching support.



## Tuition Costs

Tuition Fees vary by program. Please refer to the table below for the 2026-2027 tuition costs and payment plan options.

Tuition payments are processed through FACTS Tuition Management Company.

Your payment is directly taken out of your checking or savings account according to the schedule you select.

There is a non-refundable enrollment fee of \$50/student for returning students and \$100/student for new students.

# 4 year old programs

Our 4 year old preschool programs emphasize pre-kindergarten enrichment based on use of manipulatives, learning centers, peer interaction, and a variety of other activities that enable the child to have a comfortable transition into their kindergarten experience.

Our curriculum incorporates Christian values into our daily schedule. Students are introduced to:

- Daily prayer
- Visits to the 24 hour chapel/church sanctuary
- Bible time and saint stories
- Service projects - both in the classroom and with our school
- Faith Activities

Our curriculum focuses on school readiness skills through group instruction and playful learning through stories, songs, centers, and activities.

Students are exposed to:

- Phonemic awareness
- Critical thinking skills through age appropriate questions, stimuli and guidance
- Math readiness skills of counting, number recognition, math applications and problem solving
- Music, Art and Literature, nurturing creativity and listening skills
- Science through nature walks and in-house field trips.

Our curriculum helps to develop social and emotional skills:

- Students begin to develop a sense of self
- Students recognize their emotions as well as their peers
- Students learn to play and communicate with peers and adults

**Children entering our 4 year old program must be 4 years old by October 1 of the year that they enter the program. All students must be completely independent in the restroom by the first day of school.**

All of our preschool sessions are taught by a teacher with additional teaching support to provide more personalized attention.

# Guidelines for Preschool Class Selection



Listed below are the social emotional milestones for our programs. A young child's social competence is a vital part of development. Success in the core social emotional skills of self-regulation and pro-social behaviors is vital for future success in school and in life. Please feel free to utilize the chart in determining placement of your child. If parents have concerns about placement, please speak to the teacher or school administration. **Our programs build upon each other. Repeating the same program is not recommended.**

\*\* Please see above the guideline for social emotional growth for preschool. **Your child needs to meet these developmental milestones to be enrolled in our all day program.** In the event administration and the teacher find that your child is not able to meet the rigors of the program, or the child is not proficient in these areas, your child will attend the program on a progressive-day status. Students on progressive-day status will attend until 11:00 AM. Progressive-day status will be re-evaluated at the end of the quarter. The family will be financially responsible for the currently enrolled full-day tuition costs.
