



Pastor's Letter

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Annual Catholic Appeal Commitment Sunday. I know many of you, to include me, have already sent to the Diocese of Savannah, your gift and/or pledge. Thank you so much.

For those who have not done so, we have passed out the ACA pledge envelopes as you entered the church, and there are pencils in the pews for you to fill it out. Please, if you have never given in the past, do so this year. No gift is too small.



I also appreciate parishioner Mr. Michael Dunnermann speaking to us today at all our Masses about why it is important to support our diocesan ministries and our new bishop, Bishop Stephen Parkes. Let us show Bishop Parkes that as a growing suburban parish, we are

willing and ready to meet our obligations to the parish, the diocese, and the other good causes our offerings facilitate.

This coming Wednesday, February 17 is Ash Wednesday. We will have two Masses in our main Church, at 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. When you approach the priest or deacon for the ashes, please wear a mask, and we will also.

Elsewhere in the bulletin, please note the Church's law concerning fast and abstinence during Lent. Suffice it to say that on Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent, Catholics are not to eat meat, poultry, pork, and other meat products. Fish products are allowed. A fast day (there are only two in Lent—Ash Wednesday and Good Friday) consists of one full meal, two smaller snacks that combined do not equal a full meal, and no eating between meals. The point is to identify with Jesus when he fasted in the desert 40 days and 40 nights prior to his public ministry.

Next weekend, our parish Lenten Mission begins with a Father of Mercy, Fr. Jewel Aytona. He will preach all the Masses to encourage us to attend. The Mission is at 7:00 p.m. Sunday through Wednesday in the main Church, and Father Jewel will hear confessions at 6:00 p.m. and following his mission talk each night. A shorter version of his talk will take place following the 9:00 a.m. Mass Monday through Wednesday in our chapel, and he will hear confessions following his talk. Please note the flier for the subjects he will preach about.

Stations of the Cross are each Friday at 7:00 p.m. in the main Church. The Knights are sponsoring a fish fry this Friday, February 19 prior to the Stations.






Ciborium The ciborium holds the bread that becomes Eucharist during the Mass. It is used to distri

Jesus' Way

Today's readings present a contrast between "Jesus' way" and the "old way." An example of the old way is the law given to Moses and Aaron about leprosy: the leper was unclean and cast out of the community. Jesus' way is the opposite: the leper is reached out to, touched, and finally cured.

Nor ought we think of the "old way" as restricted to the days of Moses and Aaron, or even to the "old" testament. The difference between the old way and Jesus' way arises in own lives. We still choose, every day, to live in our old way or in Jesus' way.

Jesus dared to touch a leper, disregarding the old way. The leper then was changed forever. He felt a calling. He couldn't keep himself from proclaiming that he had been touched by Jesus (even though Jesus told him not to!). Once Jesus touches us, we are called to proclaim His way.


Lenten Regulations: Fasting and Abstinence During Lent

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.
- 2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy. It is customary to give up some kind of food, like fast food, sweets, or something else greatly loved, throughout the season of Lent. However, Sundays in Lent are not included.

included among other prayers to St. Joseph enriched with a plenary indulgence, which may be earned once a day subject to the usual conditions: sacramental confession, reception of Holy Communion, prayer for the intentions of the Pope, and a total detachment to all sin, including venial sin.
