One Lord, One Faith

Do you suppose the authors of the four Gospels were aware of today's first reading from the second book of Kings? Of course they were.

The prophet Elisha fed a hundred men with twenty barley loaves in order to prove God's power. This same miracle, now multiplied by more people fed by fewer loaves, is attributed to Jesus in all four Gospels.

In today's passage from John, we even have the detail that the loaves were barley, reminding every pious Jew of that miracle that Elisha worked.

Yet Jesus went into hiding when they wanted to make him king. It is the passage from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians that gives us the reason for this.

The power of Jesus comes from God. It is not meant merely to feed us, or to provide one group with a king. There is one Lord, one faith, one God and Father of all who works through Jesus Christ and through us all.
