




Our Church teaches us that parents are the primary teachers of the children. The additional support provided by you is meant to enhance and expand their knowledge and love of our faith.

CURRICULUM

Lessons are scheduled, planned, and will be provided to Catechists at the annual Catechist Retreat. Please aim to maintain this schedule as closely as possible so to maintain continuity with both class times. These lessons provide all of the references to scripture, the catechism and faith tradition that you will need. Requests for any additional materials that you need to carry out the lesson plan should be submitted the Thursday before class. This includes requests for copies.

Please be sure that any additional resources you use (printouts, worksheets, reference books, etc.) are approved for catechetical use by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops and the Diocese of Savannah. If you are unsure whether or not they are approved, please let me know and I will find out for you.



DROP OFF AND PICK UP

A parent is to walk children to their classrooms and sign them in each week. Please remind parents at drop off that they must come back in to sign their child out.

Some parents may express concern at having to sign their child in and out, especially older students. Remind them that this method is the safest option, and it allows weekly contact between the catechist and the parents.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE POLICIES


Per the guidelines of the diocese, we are required to keep track of student attendance. Attendance records will be kept in your notebook which you should pick up from the CCD office in Holy Family Hall before each class and return at the end. Please be sure that you mark attendance each week

SUBSTITUTES

As soon as you know that you will not be in class, please let me know of date you will be gone. There is a form on the table with the teacher sign-in sheets. If you know in advance, please coordinate with your assistant to teach the class if possible. If you have an unexpected absence because of sickness, work, etc. we will attempt to find a substitute. Please contact me as soon as possible. Sometimes we may have to combine classes for that day.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

If classes are cancelled due to inclement weather, I will send out an email to catechists. I may need your help reaching out to the students in your class to make sure every family is contacted. Updates will also be provided on CCD web page (www.stannerh.org/CCD) and on the parish Facebook page.



CHILD ABUSE

State law requires all staff and volunteers to report suspected child abuse, and we will follow diocesan policy on such matters. Every volunteer is required to take the VIRTUS: Protecting God's Children training and submit a background check.

MEDICATIONS

Catechists are never to give medicine or apply medication. If a child gets hurt please notify the CRE immediately.

PRIVACY

Out of respect for the students, catechists, and staff in our program, neither students, nor parents, nor catechists are to publicly post any videos, pictures or audio recordings of students, catechists, or staff at CCD events unless the parish office has express written permission on file. This includes, but is not limited to, online photo-sharing and posting videos to YouTube, Facebook, Twitter or other social media.


GENERAL CLASSROOM INFORMATION

If you want to take the children or teens out of the building, please let me know in advance. Two adults are required at all times. <u>Teens assisting in elementary classes do not count as an adult.</u>

PARTY GUIDELINES

Please be aware of any food restrictions your students may have prior to these parties. **CCD** class parties are to always be nut-free. That means that snacks must be without nuts and not made in a facility that also processes nuts. You are not expected to provide these for your class unless you specifically want to bring something. I can provide snacks if needed.

Parties should fall during the correct Liturgical Season (Christmas parties are held during the Christmas season- not during Advent.)



CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

It is the responsibility of the Assistant Catechist to maintain order in your classroom. You have a right to expect appropriate behavior from the students. The first day of class is the time to express your expectations to your students. The following guidelines are given to assist you with discipline in your classroom.


If the behavior of one child is interfering with the learning of the class, the catechist should, as privately and discreetly as possible, remind the child of the classroom expectations. If the problem persists, please let me know. Sometimes, a child may just need a break and will be ready to rejoin class shortly. Other times, they may need more attention.

Catechists should be careful to create a space where children feel valued and welcome. CCD is a way for them to grow in faith, so seek opportunities where you can be the face of Mercy to a child who may not have experienced that before. That does not mean that children should have free reign of the class, but be mindful that CCD is not meant to be as "rigid" as school.

Establish classroom expectations with your class on the first day. Allow them to be a part of the process so that you are creating an agreement with them, rather than dictating rules.

"THINGS TO DO EACH WEEK"

- Prepare for class (at least one hour of preparation before class time)
- On Thursday, be sure to send your requests for specific materials
- Arrive at least 15 minutes early for class. Stop in the front room to sign-in and pick up your attendance notebook. Check your notebook for flyers to be sent home or new memos.
- Be in the classroom to greet the children and parents each week.
- Take attendance.
- Keep track of the time and dismiss on time
- Return notebooks and attendance sheets to front room.
- After each class, put all supplies away, wipe down chalkboards/white boards, and put tables and chairs in order.
- Clean up any trash.



CHILD AND YOUTH PROTECTION

The protection of children and vulnerable adults is a top priority for St. Anne Catholic Church and the Diocese of Savannah. Listed her are the minimum requirements that must be met by any adult (age 18 or over) who works / volunteers in a Diocese of Savannah Church, School or Social Service Agency AND comes into contact with any youth (under age 18) during the course of their ministry.


- Attendance at the VIRTUS "Protecting God's Children for Adults" Training and registration of the above training on the website www.virtusonline.org.
- A National Criminal Background check, a check of the Sex Offender's Registry, and (preferred) a verification of the Social Security Number at least once every five years
- Read the Diocesan "Code of Conduct" and agree to its terms by signing the back page and turning it into your church or school
- Completing the "Safe Environment Refresher Training" on the VIRTUS website if it has been five years or more since attending the live class.

Teen Volunteers: Must sign a "Code of Conduct for Minor Volunteers"

Every year, we are required to teach the VIRTUS program "Empowering God's Children" to our CCD students. The course material is broken up into age groups and the material is appropriate to the age. Each year the material is expanded upon so children are exposed to new information. This year's lesson plan is *Physical Boundaries: Safe and Unsafe Touching Rules*.

This lesson will be presented in all CCD classes on **Sunday, October 24**. More details, including specific lesson plans, will be provided.
