On June 15, we began celebrating weekday Masses in the Church, except on Tuesday where the 6:30 and 8:00 a.m. Masses and Adoration are celebrated in the Chapel. This weekend, June 20 and 21, we begin celebrating our Saturday vigil and Sunday Masses in the Church at our regular Mass times. Please observe our new guidelines outlined below and follow the directions of the Ushers for entering the Church, receiving Communion, and exiting the Church.

Wear Face Masks

Face coverings are to be worn while in and around the church.

Use Hand Sanitizer

You should use hand sanitizer when entering the church.

Social Distancing

Please practice a 6-foot distance while in and around the church.

Enter Through Main Church Doors

Please use the front doors of the church when entering for Mass. Handicap side door will be open for those individuals who need assistance getting into church.

Holy Communion

We encourage you to receive Holy Communion on your hands. Those wishing to receive on their tongue should be seated in the designated area on the tabernacle side of the church.

Offertory Contributions

The poor boxes at the church entrances have been designated for your offertory contributions.

Holy Water

Fonts have been emptied; however, you are encouraged to make the sign of the cross when you enter the church.

No Hymnals

All hymnals and prayer cards have been removed from pews.

Remember, the dispensation from attending Mass is still in effect. If you are uncomfortable attending Mass under these guidelines, are feeling sick, or have a underlying medical condition, we suggest you remain at home.

From the desk of Father Ronald A. Potts:

In today's reading from the book of the Prophet Jeremiah, we find him in the most painful period of his life. As a prophet, he finds himself suffering persecution from the Israelites and his king who have disregarded God's covenant. On the other hand, God has given him an impossible mission of bringing His people and their king back to the covenant. Jeremiah feels totally and completely inadequate, "Terror on every side!" Although he is gripped by fear he is not paralyzed because the gift of faith prevails. After his cry of distress, he proclaims, "But the Lord is with me, like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph." Jeremiah puts his absolute trust in God that He will enable him to accomplish his mission according to God's will. It is to God that Jeremiah entrusts his cause, and it is upon Him that he places this heavy burden which overwhelms him. Jeremiah's cry of distress turns into a hymn of praise, "Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked." Jeremiah is an example of being spiritually poor. He teaches us to totally depend on God and trust in Him as we place our lives in His hands knowing He gives us everything we need to accomplish His will in our lives.

In St. Paul's letter to the Romans, he reminds us how sin entered our world and how all of us are born with original sin. Not only are we born with original sin but death is the consequence of Adam's sin. Paul stressed in particular God's gracious gift of salvation, "But the gift is not like the transgression." Not only does Christ repair the catastrophic state that had its origin in Adam's sin, He initiates a new, an incomparably better state. Through the sin of one, "the many died." How "much more did the grace of God and the precious gift of the one person Jesus Christ overflow for the many." In Christ we find our hope and through Him the universe has become a "new creation" because grace and mercy have been poured upon the earth through Christ's passion, death and resurrection.

We recall last week's passage from Matthew's gospel when Jesus called the Apostles by name and gave them the great commission to proclaim the kingdom of God, He knew they would meet with opposition. In today's gospel, Jesus further instructs them, "Fear no one." Although the gospel is "Good News" it radically calls into question a world built without recognition of God and values foreign and even contrary to His law. Jesus clearly teaches one thing is to be feared—to be lost, "to perish in Gehenna," body and soul, for having cut one's self off from God's love. We have nothing to fear in this life because we are precious to God. The divine solicitude is called providence. This gift has been given to us by the Father who has redeemed us by the blood of His Son, Christ our Lord: God does not wish us to perish, we are His children and He desires to share the fullness of His life and love with us in eternity.
