THE PURPOSE OF ASH WEDNESDAY'S ASHES

The Church extends to all Catholics an invitation to receive ashes. The rite of administering ashes has been created by the Church as a sacramental to make us conscious both of the reality of death and of the necessity for penance and contrition. The effect of this rite depends upon the prayerful purpose of the recipient.

Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence and also days of fast. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Abstinence requires that Catholics 14 years and older refrain from eating meat. **Fasting** requires that Catholics 18-60 years of age partake of one full meal and two lighter meals only.

Sacred Heart will be hosting a **Baby Bottle Campaign** for the Gabriel Network beginning next weekend, February 20/21. Baby Bottles will be available after all Masses. Filled baby bottles should be returned the following weekend (February 27/28). For those parishioners still not attending Mass in person, Gabriel Network has set up a virtual link. Gabriel Network is a faith based, non-profit organization that serves women throughout Maryland and DC who are facing crisis pregnancies. From the desk of Father Ronald A. Potts:

In today's passage from the Book of Leviticus, we find the teaching regarding people with leprosy. We find that they were declared unclean and were isolated from the rest of the community. They were to dwell "apart . . . outside the camp." Their lesions were not just a sign of a terrible disease, but were a reminder of the boils afflicted upon the Egyptians and their cattle. This was the punishment against Pharaoh for opposing God's will and not releasing His people from the bondage of slavery. As the Israelites recall how God spared them, Deuteronomy says the Lord would send these same lesions on His people if they were unfaithful to His law.

In St. Paul's first Letter to the Corinthians, he answers a very specific question, "Is it lawful to eat meat sold in the market place that had been sacrificed to a pagan god?" Paul answers the question clearly by saying the idols are nothing and therefore the meat may be eaten without difficulty. Those who understand this can eat the meat without scruple but they must renounce this if others in the community would be scandalized. Paul's principle is simple: everything that is permissible is not always becoming or edifying. Everything we do-eating, drinking, whatever else-we must do "for the glory of God." We must not forget that the concern for God's glory must make us careful to act in a way that others, in particular the weakest, may be encouraged to also give glory to God. Otherwise, freedom becomes a lack of respect and an obstacle to some people. The immediate interest of others takes precedence over our personal interest.

In today's passage from Mark's gospel, a leper comes to Jesus to be healed. We marvel at the courage of the leper as he approaches Jesus and kneels down saying, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Jesus does not reject him or send him away but stretches out His hand saying, "I do will it. Be made clean." This gesture and word illustrates for us the pity and compassion of Jesus not only for this leper but for all of us. Jesus asks the man to keep the news of his healing quiet and go immediately to show himself to the priests. The man cannot contain his joy and shares the news of his healing with everyone. Jesus can no longer avoid the enthusiasm of the crowds, but more importantly the overt opposition to His person and authority as the Son of God. The authorities will begin to scrutinize Him and ultimately call for His death.
