From the desk of Father Michael A. Russo:

Jesus in the Eucharist is the most amazing gift we could be given. He feeds us with Himself! It is remarkable that in the most creative way possible (it is something we could have never come up with ourselves) Jesus makes sure we have food to sustain us in our journey to Heaven. The thing that looks, tastes, smells, and feels like bread and wine, is after the words of consecration His Body and His Blood. We can eat or drink it because it tastes familiar, but we know it is truly Him; and after we consume Him, we know we are as close to God as we can possibly be this side of eternity.

This is why the Roman Church in the Medieval era developed the practice of Eucharistic adoration. This offers us an opportunity to extend our receiving Jesus at Mass, we can, to paraphrase St. John Vianney, stare at Jesus and He stares back at us. I want to thank all of you who come and spend time with our Lord in the Eucharist each Tuesday, First Friday, and First Saturday. These moments of worship bring new life to us individually and as a parish.

I especially love Adoration with our youth. The older classes of our CCD students took time almost every Tuesday to venture over to the chapel and spend time with our Lord, and by the end of the school year even the middle school boys could be heard faintly singing the Tantum Ergo! Each Thursday evening we have our high school youth group end in the chapel before the exposed Eucharist, while I hear Confessions, it is a beautiful sight and I know and have heard Jesus working in the hearts of the youth who are before Him.

May this great Solemnity of the Church be a reminder for all of us to receive our Lord reverently and to fall more in love with Him. I think this is especially important as we approach our parish feast on Friday (and celebrate it again next Sunday).

Please come out to adoration this Tuesday and this Friday. Let us all love Jesus more!
