### Baptism Godparents

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Godparent for Baptism. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

# Holy Eucharist

We invite you to participate in the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

# Confirmation Sponsors

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

### Marríage

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Either the Bride or Groom must be a registered parishioner. If you would like to get more information about getting married, please contact the Parish Office.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

In our continuing catechesis on the "Our Father", we now consider the expression: "as we forgive those who trespass against us". Since everything we have, including our very existence, comes as a gift from God, we are always in his debt, for our life was not simply willed, it was also loved into being. We can be confident, then, that the Lord will always forgive our trespasses when we ask him with contrite hearts. Yet this grace also calls us to forgive others, just as God has forgiven us. We see this in the parable of the unmerciful servant, who though having his own enormous debt written off, in turn refuses to cancel a much smaller debt owed to him. The message is clear: if you refuse to forgive, then you will not be forgiven. God, however, grants every Christian the grace to be able to transmit to others the precious gift of forgiveness, which we can do with a word, an embrace, or a smile.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Christ,

Happy Easter! "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad." This is the Psalm the Church sings on Easter Sunday morning. It recalls the Old Testament victory of King David ascending to his throne in Jerusalem in glorious triumph. He was rejected by his friends and fellow countrymen and also violently opposed by his enemies. Yet, God in His goodness vindicated him.

David prefigures Jesus Christ. This is a fitting song to sing as we praise Christ. After an earthly battle with the powers of darkness that did their worst, "God raised Him from the dead, releasing Him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on Him." (Acts 2:24) The whole Church resounds again Easter morning as we claim the truth anew "Christ is Risen"! We can never grow tired of or exhaust its riches. The glorious news "Christ is Risen" has permeated every age since the time of the apostles down to this present moment, which is our moment. God has done for us what we could never do for ourselves: "He has ransomed us from the kingdom of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son He loves." ( Col 1:13) We celebrate Easter because of God's mercy and compassion; His great desire for friendship with each of us. We access this new life through the waters of baptism. Then every life must accept and grow in the new life Christ provides.

This is why we need to proclaim again this year our own baptismal promises at Mass on Easter, and accept and claim Christ anew. For me this Easter takes on a very personal meaning. With the death of my dad this past February 4, I came face to face with the finality of death in a very personal way. Many people I have known and loved have died and I have suffered their loss, but I have now learned what I have heard before about the death of a parent as my family learns to live in a new way without my dad here with us. It is particularly trying for my mom, who was married for 58 years to my father. Their marriage was a blessing to my brother, sisters and me, and although our mom has so many happy memories, we now witness her suffering from this loss in a way that hurts us children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, too. Gratefully, her faith is strong, as is ours; I cannot imagine going through this without my knowledge and belief in the resurrection of Jesus; the gift of faith is such a blessing in life. I am doubly grateful for the gift of faith this Easter!

# From the desk of... Father Tom

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

It is important to us as an Oratorian community to care for the Church's liturgy and to aim for beautiful, reverent worship. In this spirit, as we complete our first year with you, we have assessed our abilities and the pastoral needs of the parishes we serve. After considerable prayerful reflection and discussion, including consultation with our parish staff and pastoral council, we have decided to adjust the Mass schedule. The following changes will take effect beginning on Monday, July 1, 2019:

In general, St. Ann's has good Mass attendance at all of our weekend liturgies. There will not be any changes at this time to our Sunday Mass schedule. We need greater lay support at the Sunday 5pm Mass; more volunteers to serve as Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist and Altar Servers. Please consider serving. Contact the parish office and we will arrange for training. Liturgical music ought to enrich our worship experience and will be considered in the future.

There will be an adjustment in the weekday Mass schedule. **Evening Masses will be at 7pm on Monday and Friday**, instead of Tuesday and Thursday. Multiple intentions will continue to be permitted at the two evening Masses, in keeping with Church law and within reasonable limits.

### Morning Masses will be at 7am on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

The schedule for **Holy Days of Obligation** at St. Ann's will be **7am and 7pm** on the day. When the school is in session there will be also a 9am Mass. Note that St. Ann's will not have a vigil Mass for Holy Days, however Holy Trinity Church will have a 7pm vigil Mass.

There will be only the **7pm Mass on First Fridays**, but when the school is in session there will be also a 9am Mass. Santo Nino devotions will normally follow the 7pm First Friday Mass.

There will be a **9am Mass on the civic holidays** that are official days off from work, but the location will not necessarily be at St. Ann's Church. The location will be announced in advance.

Our Mass Intention Book for the remainder of the year, starting on July 1, will be open Wednesday, May 8. Each family will be allowed three Mass Intentions. Please call or stop in to the Parish Office starting Wednesday, May 8 from 9:00am-3:30pm. **No** phone calls or walk-ins for Mass Intentions will be accepted **before** Wednesday, May 8.

Once again, I thank you for your cooperation, understanding and support. God bless you!
