

Baptism Godparents

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Godparent for Baptism. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Penance/Reconciliation

We invite you to participate in the Penance & Reconciliation at the times specified in the front of this bulletin.

Holy Eucharist

We invite you to participate in the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

Confirmation Sponsors

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Marríage

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Either the Bride or Groom must be a registered parishioner. If you would like to get more information about getting married, please contact the Parish Office.

Pope Francís General Audience June 5, 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last weekend, I made an Apostolic Journey to Romania, at the invitation of the President and the Prime Minister. I renew my appreciation to them and I extend it to the civil and ecclesiastical authorities and to all those who cooperated to bring about this visit. Above all I give thanks to God who allowed the Successor of Peter to return to that country, 20 years after the visit of Saint John Paul II.

In sum, as the motto of my journey announced, I encouraged "journeying together". It was my joy to be able to do so not from afar or from above, but by walking, myself, among the Romanian people, as a pilgrim in their land.

The various events demonstrated the value and need of journeying together, both among Christians, at the level of faith and charity, and among citizens, at the level of civil commitment.

As Christians, we have the grace of living a season of fraternal relationships among the different Churches. In Romania the majority of the faithful belong to the Orthodox Church, currently led by Patriarch Daniel, to whom go my fraternal and appreciative thoughts. The Catholic community, both 'Greek' and 'Latin', is alive and active. The union among all Christians, while incomplete, is based on the one Baptism and is sealed by blood and by the suffering endured together in the dark times of the persecution, particularly in the last century under the atheist regime. There is also another Lutheran community that likewise professes faith in Jesus Christ, and has good relationships with Orthodox and Catholics.

With the Patriarch and the Holy Synod of the Romanian Orthodox Church, we had a very cordial meeting in which I emphasized the willingness of the Catholic Church to journey together in reconciled remembrance and toward fuller unity, which the Romanian people themselves prophetically invoked during the visit of Saint John Paul II. This important ecumenical dimension of the journey culminated in the solemn prayer of the 'Our Father', in the new, imposing Orthodox Cathedral of Bucharest.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are in the midst of a very special time in the life of our Church. As we progress in our year of spiritual awakening in preparation for the consecration of our diocese to Jesus through the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Pentecost provides us with the graces and charisms we need as a diocese.

On the eve of Pentecost, we had a first for our diocese: an all-night prayer vigil with Eucharistic Adoration at our Cathedral to pray that these graces and charisms would flood our diocese. This of course, was in addition to the scores of confirmations that have been taking place over these past months with thousands of our youth and adults receiving the Holy Spirit through the sacrament of confirmation. These days are beautiful reminders of God's love for us.

As you know, all the apostles were with Jesus during his three years of public ministry, and they watched and heard all the wondrous miracles He performed. They had such high hopes as they were inspired by listening to Jesus teach, day in and out about the Kingdom of God and what it would be like. After three years of their listening to His every word and watching His loving and compassionate deeds, they believed that Jesus was the Way, the Truth and the Life. He was their Savior who would take them all to be with the Father in Heaven. They were ready to follow Him anywhere. They were all in!

But then it seemed everything fell apart, and so quickly: they had to watch Jesus be put on trial; they watched Jesus be mocked, spat upon, scourged at the pillar and even crowned with thorns. They watched as Jesus carried His own cross and finally was nailed to it and left to die. They must have been so discouraged, dejected, depressed and even fearful for their lives. Then the Resurrection changed everything, and the Apostles were comforted as they saw Iesus again, no longer a lifeless body, but risen in glory. They were with Jesus as He appeared in His resurrected body to thousands of different people. They shared meals with Him, and watched Him perform miracles again. For the Apostles it was like old times. But then, Jesus told them that He would be going away again, ascending back to heaven. For us the Ascension is a happy feast, but for the apostles and early disciples, it was not.


The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The Real Presence

Since the Middle Ages, the change of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ has been called "transubstantiation." This means that the substance of the bread and wine is changed into the substance of the Body and Blood of Christ. The appearances of bread and wine remain (color, shape, weight, chemical composition), but the underlying reality—that is, the substance—is now the Body and Blood of Christ.

With the passage of time, reverent reflection led the Church to enrich its Eucharistic devotion. Faith that Jesus is truly present in the Sacrament led believers to worship Christ dwelling with us permanently in the Sacrament. Wherever the Sacrament is, there is Christ, who is our Lord and our God. Such worship is expressed in many ways: in genuflection, in adoration of the Eucharist, and in the many forms of Eucharistic devotion that faith has nourished.

New Jersey Independent Victim Compensation Program to open June 15

As announced in February, the Diocese of Metuchen – along with the four other Roman Catholic Dioceses in New Jersey (Newark, Trenton, Camden and Paterson) – established an Independent Victim CompensationProgram (IVCP) to compensate those who, as children or young adults, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Diocese. The IVCP will be open to claims beginning June 15 and will conclude on December 31, 2019. All individual claims must be submitted during this period.

The statewide IVCP will be independently administered by Kenneth R.Feinberg and Camille S. Biros, two noted victims' compensation experts who have nationwide experience in administering varying compensation programs such as the Penn State sexual abuse claims, the 9/11 Victim Compensation Fund, and the Boston Marathon bombing compensation fund.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and will operate independently of the Diocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be

independently determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims – no matter when the abuse occurred – are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially.

Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to www.njdiocesesivcp.com and reviewing the protocol for submitting a claim. The implementation of the IVCP is an important step in aiding victims in seeking justice and healing, and as we journey together as a Church toward a new day.

Transparency, justice and truth, remain a top priority for Bishop Checchio, who in a February letter to the Church of Metuchen, said, "As sad as this day is for the Church, I remember daily that God has called me to this diocese, to be here with you and to walk down this road back to Him with transparency, justice and truth to promote healing, confidence and renewal. The challenges the Church faces now may seem daunting, but we must not fear the days ahead; Christ walks with us. Together, we will journey toward a new day. Even though our Church today inherited these problems from the past, we are to be part of the solution to ensure these horrific crimes are never repeated in the future."

Anyone who has been the victim of sexual abuse by a priest of the Diocese is encouraged to participate in the IVCP.

Faith Formation - Sacrament Program

Sacrament Faith Formation classes are not just about receiving Sacraments but a way of making connections between life and faith and to lead the children and their family to a closer personal relationship with Christ. St. Ann PREP Program is open to all registered parishioners for children in grades one through eight. Families wishing to register for Children's Faith Formation classes must be registered parishioners of St. Ann Church. If you need assistance with parish registration, you may contact the Parish Office at 908-725-1008.

Children entering the first grade in public school this coming September should enroll in the first level of Children's Faith Formation classes. The Diocese of Metuchen requires that children wishing to receive First Holy Communion must prepare for a period of two years. Young people entering preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, families must be registered parishioners of St. Ann Church. The Sacrament process includes a two-year program preparation and beneficial if the young person has either previously attended a Catholic School or Faith Formation Program.
