

Baptism Godparents

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Godparent for Baptism. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Penance/Reconciliation

We invite you to participate in the Penance & Reconciliation at the times specified in the front of this bulletin.

Holy Eucharist

We invite you to participate in the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

Confirmation Sponsors

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Marríage

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Either the Bride or Groom must be a registered parishioner. If you would like to get more information about getting married, please contact the Parish Office.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our catechesis on the Acts of the Apostles, we have seen that the Church's evangelizing mission begins with the resurrection of Christ. As the disciples, together with Mary, waited in the Upper Room for the fulfilment of Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit, they were united in prayer. From the beginning, the Church appears as a communion, a community, the People of God. Christ's choice of twelve Apostles shows the continuity between the Church and the people of Israel. After the defection of Judas, the Apostles were conscious that his place in the Twelve had to be taken by another. Guided by Peter, the community as a whole joined in prayer to discern the Lord's choice of Matthias. Jesus had told his disciples that they would be known by their love for one another (In 13:35). The visible communion of the Apostles was their first form of witness to the Risen Lord and his saving love. May we too bear witness to the reconciling power of that love by our unity, which triumphs over pride and divisiveness, and creates from diversity the one People of God.

That priests, through the modesty and humility of their lives, commit themselves actively to a solidarity with those who are most poor. My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

To continue...As Jesus ascended to the Father, the Apostles must have felt like Good Friday all over again. Alone, without Jesus, they felt deserted once more. But Jesus does not desert the Apostles. In fact, He makes a great promise to them. He tells them the Father will send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit who will teach and guide them. The Holy Spirit would be the divine presence for the Apostles. They are told that even in their most challenging times, they should remember the Holy Spirit will be with them. Jesus promises them and us as well that through the Holy Spirit, God Himself would intimately be with us forever, to accompany us throughout our lives until we return to the Father in heaven.

During these past weeks, I have been praying intensely for a new out-pouring of the Holy Spirit on us, our families and our diocesan Church. I thank all who have joined us in praying to our Advocate and want to remind everyone that we are not alone in this prayer. Mary, Jesus' own mother, was with the Apostles in that Upper Room in Jerusalem, and she is always with us as we pray. The Holy Spirit who made the Immaculate Virgin Mary His purest home and sanctuary likewise chooses to make each of us beautiful temples of His, too. Our all-night prayer vigil at our Cathedral will no doubt help to produce good gifts of the Spirit for us.

Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am in their midst, Jesus told us, and so He hears our every need. And we have many needs this year. Indeed, the Holy Spirit who comes upon us in baptism and confirmation is the same Spirit who came upon the Apostles at the first Pentecost, giving birth to the Church. The Holy Spirit sent them into the world to proclaim the wonderful works God had accomplished in Christ. The Spirit now sends each baptized person into the world to witness to Jesus and build up His Body, the Church.

and all who come after us-


this great land will always be "one nation, under God,



Faith Formation - Sacrament Program

Sacrament Faith Formation classes are not just about receiving Sacraments but a way of making connections between life and faith and to lead the children and their family to a closer personal relationship with Christ. St. Ann PREP Program is open to all registered parishioners for children in grades one through eight. Families wishing to register for Children's Faith Formation classes must be registered parishioners of St. Ann Church. If you need assistance with parish registration, you may contact the Parish Office at 908-725-1008.

Children entering the first grade in public school this coming September should enroll in the first level of Children's Faith Formation classes. The Diocese of Metuchen requires that children wishing to receive First Holy Communion must prepare for a period of two years. Young people entering preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, families must be registered parishioners of St. Ann Church. The Sacrament process includes a two-year program preparation and beneficial if the young person has either previously attended a Catholic School or Faith Formation Program.
