

We invite you to participate in the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

Confirmation Sponsors

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Marriage

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Either the Bride or Groom must be a registered parishioner. If you would like to get more information about getting married, please contact the Parish Office.

Pope Francís General Audience October 9, 2019 From the desk of... Bíshop James F. Checchío October 3, 2019



Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Beginning with the narrative of the stoning of Stephen, a figure emerges which, along with that of Peter, is the most present and significant in the Acts of the Apostles: that of "a young man named Saul" (Acts 7:58). At first, he is described as one who approves of Stephen's death and wants to "lay waste the Church" (cf. Acts 8:3); but he will later become God's chosen instrument to proclaim the Gospel to the peoples (cf. Acts 9:15; 22:21; 26:17).

With the high priest's endorsement, Saul hunts down Christians and captures them. Those of you who come from populations who are persecuted by dictatorships, you well understand what it means to hunt people down and capture them. That is what Saul did. And he does this believing he is serving the Law of the Lord. Luke says that Saul 'was breathing' "threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord" (Acts 9:1): there is a breath in him which reeks of death, not life.

The young Saul is portrayed as uncompromising; that is, one who manifests intolerance towards those who think differently from himself. He makes his own political and religious identity absolute and he reduces the other to a potential enemy to be fought. An ideologue. In Saul, religion had been transformed into ideology: religious ideology, social ideology, political ideology. Only after being transformed by Christ will he teach that the true battle is not "against flesh and blood, but against ... the world rulers of this present darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness" (Eph 6:12). He will teach that one must not fight against people but rather the evil that inspires their actions.

Saul's state of anger — because Saul is angry — and hostility invites each of us to question ourselves: How do I live my life of faith? Do I seek to encounter others or am I counter to others? Do I belong to the universal Church (the good, the bad, everyone) or do I have a selective ideology? Do I adore God or do I adore dogmatic formulations? How is my religious life? Does the faith in God that I profess make me friendly or hostile towards those who are different from me?

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

To continue...As we walked, we carried our prayers and intentions along with us, asking the Lord to make us His disciples, witnesses, to lead others in our diocese to Him, too. On pilgrimage, we try not to be weighed down, so we only take essentials with us, what we need to sustain us. Of course, Jesus encourages His disciples to approach our life on earth in this same way. Our ultimate pilgrimage on earth is to lead us to heaven, and to take along as many others as we can.

So when we go on a pilgrimage we go with a goal in mind, we are going someplace, and we went on our Walking Pilgrimage to prepare for the consecration of our diocese on Dec. 12. We went with the Lord, in prayer, ending with our final Mass on the grounds of Immaculate Conception with a Mass with more than 1,000 people in attendance. What an inspiring sight!

It was edifying to see so many families, youth from our Catholic schools and religious education programs, many of our seminarians and those in consecrated life from our diocese, and even many seniors making this pilgrimage. St. Juan Diego's heart burned in love of Jesus, Mary and His Church. Nothing was going to stop him from making his pilgrimage for his catechism lessons to prepare him for his first holy Communion. Certainly, I prayed that we, too, would have such love in our hearts for Jesus, His Church and Our Lady!

The Walk actually began at 11 a.m. with everyone praying the rosary together, then singing hymns and songs of praise and worship along the walk. We were blessed with 23 priests who accompanied the pilgrimage group along the route in prayer and offered to hear confessions. An outdoor Eucharistic Holy Hour in a park along the way was a memorable highlight, and the final three miles included carrying the Eucharist in procession back to Immaculate Conception Church in Annandale.

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - October 27, 2019

Please remember that, beginning next weekend, there will be <u>only one collection</u> in support of the ordinary operation of St. Ann Parish. Going forward, any additional envelopes besides the regular weekly envelope should also be included in that one collection. This change in parish practice requires a reassessment of one's level of financial support for our parish operation. Below is a guide for your consideration to perhaps assist you in making an intentional decision about sharing your gifts sacrificially, generously and proportionally. I encourage you to prayerfully approach this reassessment by reflecting on the scriptural teaching of stewardship. If you are not familiar with the concept of stewardship, here it is in a nutshell:

Summary of the Theology of Stewardship

- All that we have and all that we are is a gift from God our time, our talent, our money and even the gift of life itself.
- God gives us all these many gifts out of great love.
- God's intention is not for us to be actual owners of these gifts, using them only for ourselves, or hoarding them, or ignoring our gifts by placing them under a bushel basket.
- Rather, God's purpose is that we be good stewards, managers, or caretakers of these gifts by using them responsibly, generously and wisely for building up the Kingdom of God.
- The very purpose of our lives is to use our unique set of gifts for:
 - Loving and serving God and neighbor;
 - Living our unique and personal calling or vocation from the Lord.
- God desires that we freely choose to use our gifts this way and that our motives be love, thankfulness, and justice as opposed to guilt and fear.
- God promises many blessings for those who generously share their gifts as he asks, including inner peace and happiness, eternal life, and his care and protection.

Stewardship means giving back to God in gratitude for all He has given us. Giving from our treasure, our money, is a pillar of our faith — just like attending Sunday Mass or participating in parish ministries.
