


Stewardship Reflection on Lectionary Readings IS 66:10-14C; PS 66:1-7, 16, 20; GAL 6: 14-18; LK 10:1-12, 17-20

In today's Gospel passage, from Luke, we find our Lord appointing disciples to go out and prepare others to receive His invitation into the Kingdom of God. Every verse has something to say about the way a Christian steward should approach others. Let's consider at least one of the coaching tips Christ gives.

"The Lord appointed seventy-two others whom He sent out ahead of Him in pairs to every town and place He intended to visit." In His wisdom, Christ sent His disciples out not as individuals but in pairs, as teams. This approach to evangelization certainly provided practical advantages. The disciples could lean on each other for mutual support and encouragement, helping each other to stay on task and to put their heads together to pray and problem-solve. This teamwork approach is just as relevant to us modern-day Christian stewards. It takes courage and commitment to go out and invite others into the Christian life. We need to work together to do it well.

But there is also symbolic importance to working in teams. It points to the reality that when we invite others to embrace the Good News of the Gospel, we are not merely inviting them into a belief system, but into a relationship with Christ and through that relationship, into Christ's family — our fellow Christian disciples near and far.

Our parish is our immediate spiritual family in this extended worldwide fold. We are not meant to live as isolated individuals within the parish any more than we are meant to live in isolation within our families. We are meant to be a community. That is why it is so important for us to foster a vibrant, supportive, welcoming parish life. This is why we emphasize hospitality as one of the pillars of stewardship. It is not enough just to point others to Christ; we must invite them to join us in community with Him; we must offer a place and mission for them within the Church and our parish family in -Catholic Stewardship Consultants, www.CatholicSteward.com

A Catholic Primer on In Vitro Fertilization

"Today, for a wide range of possible reasons, more and more couples are experiencing the pain of infertility. Many ...deeply desire to have biological children and turn to biomedical technologies like in vitro fertilization (IVF) to try to fulfill their dreams. As Catholics, however, our faith teaches that these popular procedures are not the answer. In fact, they are harmful and wrong, and even tragically result in the deaths of many innocent children while they are young embryos. ... [However,] there are ethical fertility treatments of which the Catholic Church approves. These can take many forms but are collectively referred to as 'restorative reproductive medicine.' Restorative reproductive medicine investigates and seeks to heal the root causes of the couple's infertility... In fact, restorative reproductive medicine is often more successful than IVF. ... A number of national Natural Family Planning (NFP) education organizations can assist married couples with a list of medical professionals who provide Restorative Reproductive Medicine (RRM); please see https://bit.ly/nfp-providers."

Mass Intentions are now available for the second half of the year, July through December 2025. You may schedule a requested Mass intention by contacting Christine Esposito at the Parish Office.

The practice of offering Mass for particular intentions is an ancient one, dating back to the early Church. Mass intentions refer to the particular purpose for which a specific Mass is offered. An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. A typical donation for a specific Mass intention is \$10.

Parishioner Financial Support

The principal means of support for the Catholic Church of St. Ann is your weekly generosity. What is normally donated online and your sacrificial offering at Mass makes up the "ordinary income" that is supposed to balance the expense of ordinary parish operation, made up of salaries and benefits for the employees of the parish who serve you; all utilities and supplies; ministries and formation programs; resources needed for quality liturgies; snowplowing and landscaping, maintenance and custodial services to the buildings and properties–church, convent, rectory/office and school building. Please keep this in mind when assessing your regular level of financial support to the parish.
