Sunday August 2, 2020 ~ The Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Bishop's Pen...

"They all ate and were satisfied."

Imagine a family with a dozen children. Assuming, that like most of us, they are not monetarily wealthy, feeding a family of that size would not be easy and there often won't be enough for "seconds" at the table. Still, everyone in that family managed to get enough to eat, stay healthy and grow. Even in the midst of their own needs, that family would always welcome, and tried to help, those they found in need, even allowing friends to share their home for awhile, when those friends found themselves temporarily without a place to live. This family's philosophy is that "God will always provide."

In feeding the 5,000, Jesus gives us a far greater lesson than that "God will always provide." He shows us not only the miraculous way that God provides, but also how God intends to provide, through us. Jesus told His disciples, "There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves." When they brought the gifts of bread and fish to our Lord, He blessed them and multiplied them so that there would more than enough for all to eat. However, He gave those blessed gifts to His disciples to go and feed the 5,000.

Through His disciples, Jesus fed the bodily needs of the crowd that followed Him, just as He was feeding their spiritual needs with His teachings. When Jesus fed the 5,000, the bread foreshadowed the Eucharist, in which Jesus would give us Himself, at the Last Supper. The fish represented the people who are being fed; therefore, it is not surprising that the fragments collected were more than the original amount of bread, and fish. This miracle of the loaves and fish shows us that Jesus will always be there for us in the Eucharist and that the number of people who will come to Him to be fed will continue to grow.

Jesus tells us, His disciples today, to go and evangelize to those around us, bringing them to Christ, so that He can feed their Spiritual hunger. Jesus calls us to feed their physical hunger through the charity of our own lives. Then they can hear the Word of God that we proclaim with our lives, bringing them to Christ, so that He can feed their spiritual hunger with Himself, in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

SACRAMENTS

Infant Baptisms: Parents requesting baptism must be registered active members of the Parish. A Catholic godparent must be a registered and practicing Catholic, confirmed in writing by his or her proper pastor. Baptisms are on the last Sunday of each month, after 11 am Mass . Parents may pick up a Baptism Registration Packet from the church office during business hours. Participation in Pre-Baptismal Program is required.

Marriage: Couples seeking to be married in the Church are to make arrangements with the pastor six months to a year in advance of their intended wedding date in order to allow time for the couple to complete marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged must be a registered active member of this Church.

<u>LIVE THE LITURGY</u> INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

What do you really hope and hunger for? We are most familiar with our physical hungers and cravings as they are quite obvious. What we don't always realize is that we also have emotional and spiritual hungers. Many are starving for acceptance and love. Many others hunger for a sense of purpose, more focused direction, and deeper connection and meaning. Our hungers can

easily get confused. We think we are in need of one thing but are actually being driven by another. We need to recognize and pursue our spiritual hungers. If we do not do so, we will attempt to fill these needs with lesser, and not always healthier, things. God, ultimately through the Eucharist, is the only One who can quench our more profound thirsts. Have we discovered this yet?

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

First Reading

Near the end of Israel's captivity in Babylon (597-538 BC), the prophet Isaiah spoke of the Lord's desire to be unimaginably generous and life-giving to his people.

How has the Lord been generous in gifts to you and your family?

Second Reading

In his letter to the Christians in Rome, Paul speaks of God's inseparable bond of love for us through Jesus Christ.

In what ways does this sense of God's love for us help you in times of stress and anxiety?

Gospel Reading

In the immediate aftermath of the news of the death of John the Baptist, Matthew reports that Jesus, "moved with pity," cured those who were sick in the crowds and fed the entire crowd of 5,000.

How do you react toward others for whom you feel "pity"?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Sunday Mass

Question:

Why do Catholics need to go to Mass every Sunday?

Answer:

The heart of the Church's instruction that we are to attend Mass on Sundays goes back to the Third Commandment: "Take care to keep holy the sabbath day as the LORD, your God, has commanded you" (Deuteronomy 5:12). Although the Jewish People celebrate the Sabbath on Saturday, the first generations of Christians began to observe the sabbath on Sunday, recognizing how important it is for Christians to celebrate the day that Jesus rose from the dead. As the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults observes, "Sunday extends the celebration of Easter throughout the year ... It makes present the new creation brought about by Christ" (364).

The focus of our Sunday should be the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass. This is our time to be formed by God's Word and nourished at the table of the Lord, becoming prepared to live out and share our faith in the week that follows. In his encyclical, Dies Domini, Pope Saint John Paul II reminded us that Christians "cannot live their faith or share fully in the life of the Christian community unless they take part regularly in the Sunday Eucharistic assembly" (no. 81). This is why the Church teaches us that Sunday Mass is a nonnegotiable part of being a Christian (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2192).

Beyond being a time of worship, we should also remember that Sunday is intended to be a day of rest, when we make time for recreation, for sharing meals, and enjoying the company of friends and family. Sunday is given to us as a day to take stock of and enjoy the blessings that God has given us (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2187). Pope Francis reminds us, "The day of rest, centered on the Eucharist, sheds its light on the whole week, and motivates us to greater concern for nature and the poor" (Laudato Si', no. 237).




