From the Bishop's Pen...

"He changed his mind and went."

Quite often, the love, forgiveness, and patience that parents have for their children are a direct reflection of the love, forgiveness and patience that our heavenly Father shows to His adopted children on earth.

One of the first words that a toddler learns is NO! As a parent, how would you feel if you asked your child to "mow the lawn" and your child said no? Would you feel disappointed? In today's Gospel parable, that is just what one son tells his father when asked to work in the father's vineyard.

As a parent, how would you feel if you then asked your other child to "mow the lawn" and that child said yes; however, when you look at your lawn an hour later, it has not been mowed? You might feel not only disappointed, but a little deceived by your child's agreement to do what you asked and then did not do it. In today's Gospel parable, that is just what the other son does when his father asked him to work in the father's vineyard.

Later, you find out that your first child actually had a change of heart and mowed the lawn. You are elated! That is Jesus' message to the chief priests and elders of the people: change your hearts! It means nothing if we say yes to God, but do not do what He asks.

Yet, even those who at first say no to God, but have a change of heart and do as our heavenly Father asks, will enter the kingdom of heaven before those who give only "lip service" to His commands.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

When making decisions, we often struggle with what voice to follow. We acknowledge the presence of God, the existence of the Trinity, the priority of the Gospel, and the virtues and values they embody. Yet, even with all of that truth, knowledge, and tradition behind us, we think we know better. When confronted with a decision, we easily dismiss what we know we ought and need to do and entertain responses that stem from lesser desires and wants. We eventually may

come around and realize that what God asks us to do is what we need to do, even if it wasn't our original intention. God accepts our return to Him with joy. What becomes dishonest is deceiving ourselves, God, and others by originally saying yes to what we know we need (and are asked to do) and willfully doing something else. That is blatant hypocrisy.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

The Tradition of Genuflection

Question:

Why do Catholics genuflect?

Answer:

Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means "to bend the knee." For many Catholics, it's an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of "bending the knee" is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians, who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel that we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.

In addition to genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament, we are also instructed to genuflect before the cross used for veneration on Good Friday (during the solemn celebrations of the Lord's Passion) and any time a relic of the True Cross is displayed for veneration. This long-standing tradition is a way of honoring the cross as the great sign of our salvation and of showing devotion to the passion of Jesus.




