Sunday August 21, 2022 ~ The Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Bishop's Pen...

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate."

J. Wellington Wimpy was better known as just plain "Wimpy" from the cartoon strip "Popeye." Wimpy is the hamburger eating friend of Popeye. However, as much as Wimpy liked to eat hamburgers, he did not want to work to pay for them himself. His famous catchphrase was, "I'll gladly pay you Tuesday for a hamburger today."

Wimpy was lazy and wanted to "put off" any work he should do, until another day. He believed that he always had "tomorrow" (he called it Tuesday); to accomplish what he should do today. If Wimpy really intended to pay for today's hamburger tomorrow, what is wrong with his logic? Wimpy's logic is not as reasonable as it may sound, because tomorrow is promised to no one. Wimpy's procrastination will cost him the "narrow gate" of opportunity to do what he should when he should do it.

In our Gospel, Jesus tells us to "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." The "narrow gate" is Jesus. To enter the gate that is Jesus, we must answer His call to follow Him. Jesus calls us to follow Him by striving to live a life of holiness. Striving for a life of holiness takes work. So, when should we start to strive to follow Jesus' call to holiness, today or tomorrow?

Jesus goes on to tell us that "After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, Lord, open the door for us. He will say in reply I do not know where you are from." We do not know when God will close the door to our earthly lives. When He does, the "narrow gate" we are called to enter will be closed to us. Do we want to be outside, or inside of the "narrow gate?"

When we look at our lives today, is there anything that we wish we had done to answer our Lord's call to holiness 'yesterday,' which we did not do? Fortunately, we still have "today" to do anything we need to do, but there is no guarantee that we can put it off until "tomorrow."

When God calls us into eternal life, we do not want to be standing outside the "narrow gate," knocking to get in. When we prepare for eternal life, by striving for holiness in this life, we "will recline at table in the kingdom of God." When it comes to preparing for eternal life, Jesus is telling us, "Do not put off until tomorrow, what you can do today."

LIVE THE LITURGY:

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Discipline is necessary for us to focus our attention and develop and refine our skills. A disciplined person has integrity and can make difficult but necessary choices. Most people do not like discipline, especially children. When we have to rise above our impulses and desires and do something challenging, it can appear as a punishment. The struggles of living a good and effective Christian life, especially when we actively choose virtue over vice, are allowed by God and necessary for reaching spiritual maturity. God invites us to share in His Kingdom. Hearing and accepting that invitation requires an active, conscious decision on our part. Reforming our lives and changing how we do things does not come easily. But it is precisely what is necessary for us to enter through the narrow gate that leads to life. Discipline is essential if we are going to discover our desire for union with our Creator and live in God's house. In this way, we will not risk finding the door locked when we need it to be open.

Gratitude

Question:

How can I practice gratitude in my everyday life?

Answer:

God has given each of us many blessings. Fostering an "attitude of gratitude" might be easier than you think. Simple, concrete practices can help us to be more thankful more often. Incorporate it into your dinner with your spouse, or as you tuck the kids into bed at night. "What are three things you're thankful for today?" Make a habit of writing one note a week to someone special in your life, thanking them for how they've impacted you. This is also a good practice in the workplace. Consider opening your weekly meetings with a quick round of gratitude sharing. "I'm grateful John helped me with that last-minute change to my presentation last week. I wouldn't have finished it in time for the meeting without him."

Another way is to designate a few minutes to thank God. This could be the first bit of your daily prayer time or after you receive communion on Sundays. You can also integrate it into your daily routine. How about while brushing your teeth? There's probably nothing so important it can't wait two minutes. Brush your teeth, quiet your mind, and thank God from your heart for His blessings throughout the day. Get creative! Any moment is an opportunity to praise and thank God.

William Mooney was the Facilities Manager, Stephanie Greenhouse, Parish Manager, Bill Bell, Administrative Assistant, Gladys Ayala was the parish secretary and Althea Holland, was the Member Services Coordinator.
