Sunday June 11, 2023 ~ The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

From the Bishop's Pen...

"My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink."

At the Offertory of every Mass, the gifts that will be used at the Altar will be bread and wine. Jesus chose bread and wine, because they are available everywhere in the world, so that Catholics everywhere in the world can receive the living Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ. That is why Jesus said in today's Gospel, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

At the Passover Meal, all the Apostles received a piece of what was "one loaf of bread," now the "one Body" of Jesus. They drank from what was the "one cup of wine," now the "one cup of Jesus' Blood." Upon consuming the Body & Blood of Jesus, our Lord entered each Apostle, and with that, each of them became members of the one Body of Christ, the Church. They were many who became united as ONE!

The individual members of our bodies do not work independently of each other, but are united as ONE, acting for the good of the whole body. As members of the Body of Christ, united as ONE in our Baptism and in the Eucharist, we are called to act as ONE, for the good of all in the Body of Christ.

In celebrating the Feast of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ, we celebrate our unity with God and with each other in love. St. Paul said it well in our Second Reading, "Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf."

Jesus wants us to celebrate our unity in Him in the Eucharist, for as long as the Church is on earth. That is why He commanded His Apostles to, "do this in memory of me." Two thousand years later, we still do!

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Real Presence

Question:


How do you explain "Real Presence" to children?

Answer:

The first Communion class is filled with excitement to the point of bursting! They are just awestruck by every new thing they learn about Jesus. Their enthusiasm is contagious as they rattle off the names of the things in church, the vessels and vestments used at Mass, and the names of their pastors and priests. Of course, they know Christ can do anything because he's God. He comes to us in Holy Communion because he loves us so much that he wants to be with us. And he comes to us in the form of bread and wine. We really receive him in the Eucharist.

Sometimes it is easier to explain this to children than to adults. Their faith and trust in Jesus is not limited by the questions and doubts that often come with the question of how he does it. Rather, they focus on the question "why," and the answer is something they can easily grasp: love. Christ wants to be with us because he loves us. Nothing is purer in truth or in faith. Not even the theological explanation of transubstantiation, or philosophical reasoning or symbolic references, come close. Christ takes on the form of bread and wine to be simple and approachable, so that no one is afraid or turned away. His love for us is complete and total. We try to love him the same way in return. For a child, it is simple. For us adults, we keep trying. "Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3)
