From the Bishop's Pen...

"I say to you, forgive not seven times, but seventy-seven times."

As a parent, if your little child comes to you after spilling his or her drink and says, "I'm sorry," would you forgive your child? How many times could your little child come to you and say, "I'm sorry" before you say, "I do not forgive you."?

How many times would you forgive that child once the child is a teenager? How many times would you forgive that child once the child is an adult? What if this was your neighbor's child? When have we forgiven someone enough times?

Peter asks Jesus that very question, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus tells Peter, and us, how God gives His mercy of forgiveness, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." Jesus does not mean that we do not have to forgive on the seventy-eighth time, but that we must always be ready to forgive when we are asked for forgiveness. Jesus never turns us away in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, regardless of the number of times we ask for forgiveness.

Forgiveness is showing the love Jesus calls us to have for each other. Jesus tells us how important our love for one another is in God's eyes: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

If we ever feel that another deserves "judgment" rather than forgiveness, we must remember that "judgment" is left to God. God will judge us as we judge another; however, God will also forgive us in the same measure that we forgive one another. The choice is ours to make.



WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Psychics and Mediums

Question:

Are Catholics allowed to visit psychics? Why or why not?

Answer:

It's part of human nature to experience some sense of unease and fear about the future. This can lead some people to seek out the services of psychics or consult horoscopes or turn to other occult practices or resources (e.g. Ouija boards or tarot cards). The Catechism of the Catholic Church is very clear that Catholics should avoid such practices: "Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history, and, in the last analysis, other human beings, as well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe to God alone" (no. 2116).

Despite the uncertainties we might feel, we are called to have faith and trust in God, confident of God's desire for what is best for us. This means that we are called to surrender, to pray and to reflect on how we can best move into the future in hope, knowing that God is with us.



Ouestion:

Why do we celebrate Catechetical Sunday?

Answer

The mission of the church reflects the mission of Jesus to teach, preach, heal, and forgive. Through these acts, Jesus shares the good news of salvation and invites all people to share in the life and love of God. The church continues this mission in all its ministries, but especially, and perhaps most importantly, through catechesis.

Catechetical Sunday is celebrated on the third Sunday of September. The task of handing on the Gospel is entrusted to the whole community, who by word and example, form young and new members in the way of the Gospel. Parish programs assist parents in teaching the basics of faith through liturgical experience, instruction, and faith formation. This ministry is essential for the parish to grow, for individuals to develop as believers, and for the ongoing spiritual formation of the whole community. It reminds the church that preaching the Gospel and growing in faith are essential to our sacramental practice and our liturgical prayer.
