From the Bishop's Pen...

"Tell those invited: 'Behold, I have prepared my banquet, come to the feast."

In today's Gospel parable, Jesus likens the kingdom of heaven to a king giving a wedding banquet for his son. The king is God. His home is the kingdom of heaven. He invited His chosen guests, the people of Israel, to enter and join in His feast. The feast celebrates the marriage and salvation of God and man through His Son's incarnation, suffering, death, and resurrection.

When the invited guests ignored the King's invitation, He invited anyone around to come to His feast. These are the people of the New Covenant, who would become the Church, the Body of Christ. However, even these "new" guests who accepted the King's invitation each had to be properly dressed to attend such a sumptuous banquet.

In the kingdom of heaven, the proper dress for any invited guest is a pure, sinless soul. A spotless soul is the only acceptable garment for an invited guest to wear in the presence of the King of heaven.

For us, the meaning is the same. Each of us has received our invitation to the kingdom of heaven through our Baptism. However, to stay in the kingdom, we must dress our souls properly. Our souls, cleansed through Baptism, must be dressed properly by living the new Commandment of Love — for God and for each other.

Our wedding garment is composed of repentance and the good deeds that our Lord commands us to live as members of His Kingdom, the Body of Christ. We cannot live by just the letter of the law, but by the spirit of the law. If we do not, we will not remain in the kingdom of heaven, just as the guest, without the proper wedding attire, was thrown out into the cold.

Our place in the kingdom of God is earned with good deeds that help others, not with simply good intentions that we never put into action.



Answer:


Revenge is inflicting harm for harm's sake, the idea of an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, and then some. There is often a fine line between justice and mercy, between compensation and forgiveness. Unfortunately, things can happen to us that cause harm, suffering, and damage, regardless of people's intentions. When someone is hurt, especially in such a way that special care or treatment is required, the cost of that care needs to be paid.

In a perfect world, those with special needs, handicaps, or disabilities would find the help and care they need, including those who are injured or hurt. But justice is not always forthcoming, and people are not always fair. So, using the legal system to right a wrong is sometimes the only option.

In some cases, it is the only way that people can get the help they need and deserve. However, frivolous lawsuits, or 'fishing for money' is not only unfair, but immoral as well. The law is there to protect people and making use of it when necessary is a good thing.




