Sunday October 22, 2023 ~ The Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Bishop's Pen...

"Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God."

The Pharisees thought that they had set a trap for Jesus. They were against paying a tax to the Roman Emperor, Caesar. The Herodians were in favour of paying Caesar's tax, because they accepted the financial advantages of the Roman administration in Palestine. The Pharisees thought that they had Jesus "boxed in," with agreement of the tax being against the people, or in opposition to the tax being against the Romans authorities.

Jesus answered their question, "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" without committing to either side, when He took a coin and asked: "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's." At that He said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

Jesus was telling the Pharisees and Herodians that those who willingly used Caesar's coin should repay him in kind. However, when Jesus told them to repay to God what belongs to God, He raised the debate to a new level. Those who had hypocritically asked about tax, in respect to its relation to the law of God, should have been concerned instead with repaying God with the good deeds that are His due.

For us, the Gospel message is the same. Each of us has dual citizenship. We are citizens of our own countries as well as citizens of God's kingdom. We owe our country for the things we receive, and we pay with the currency of our country. At times we may think that the accumulation of that currency determines our worth. Our true worth, however, comes from the fact that the likeness of God is inscribed on our bodies and souls.

Perhaps this story has less to do with reminding us of what belongs to Caesar, or to the government, and more with reminding us of what belongs to God. Can we see that everything belongs to God? Then there is no need to have divided loyalties in our lives? Can we see that everything in our lives should be affected by our relationship to God?

Jesus did not answer the question about what is Caesar's and what is God's. He left that answer for His questioners to decide. Now, He wants each one of us to also decide.



WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Dropped Host

Question:


What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?

Answer:

This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).


NATIONAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH
