From the Bishop's Pen...

"Make straight the paths of the Lord."

The shortest distance between two points is a straight line. The prophet Isaiah writes: "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you: he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.'"

Our Lord wants to travel a straight path to our hearts. For that to happen, we must prepare by making straight the path we must travel to our Lord, the same path that He is to travel to our hearts. Whenever we sin, we put a "crook" in our path to our Lord.

Most of the important tasks and projects we attempt in life have a definitive timeline. We know how much time we have to accomplish our tasks. Sometimes we can procrastinate, or veer "off-course," and wait until we are near the deadline to accomplish our tasks. In preparing for the Lord's coming, we also have a definitive timeline to spend in this life to "prepare" for eternal life. The difference is that we do not know when our earthly deadline will come. We always need to travel a straight path to the Lord!

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist proclaims a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Repentance of wrongs we have committed is the way we correct the "crooks" and straighten our path to the Lord.

We are truly blessed that the Lord sought us out at His first coming and that He willingly came to us on that first Christmas. He gave Himself to us so that if we keep our focus on Him, the graces of His Sacraments will help us "make straight His path" in our lives. Then at His second coming, our Lord will have the straight path He desires to our souls, the path that we will travel to eternal life with Him.





WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

CAN CATHOLICS GAMBLE?

Question:

The Bible says that Jesus condemned gambling, but I notice that so many parishes have them at festivals and other events. What's correct?


Answer:

Although Jesus speaks of our relationship with material wealth and the very human struggle with greed, the gospels do not include any specific instructions related to gambling. At the same time, the Church is very sensitive to the needs of those who might struggle with an addiction to gambling, and pastoral care should always be offered to those who struggle with this reality in their life.

While it is true that many parishes or school communities include gambling or games of chance in festivals and fundraisers (e.g. bingo, roulette, ring tossing, dunking booths, etc.), there is nothing inherently wrong with these sorts of events, given they are played fairly and within the limits of reason are not morally objectionable. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Games of chance (card games, etc.) or wagers are not in themselves contrary to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others" (no. 2413).

As in all things, moderation and a sense of healthy limits should be applied to gambling and games of chance. For those who find themselves living with addiction to gambling, help is available in various 12-step and addiction recovery programs.


