Sunday March 31, 2024 ~ Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of the Lord

From the Bishop's Pen...

"He has been raised from the dead."

Mary Magdalene was crying as she rushed to the Tomb where they buried Jesus, in the early hours of First Day of the Week. She was shocked and bewildered when she saw that huge stone removed from the tomb. She ran to tell Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved (John), what she had found. Peter first, then John, went into the empty tomb, and John saw and believed. John knew that his faith in Jesus was true, that his faith in God's promise to send Israel a Savior, was justified.

Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection bought eternal life with God for us. Jesus rescued Mary Magdalene from her troubles and gave her another chance at life as His disciple. Jesus forgave Peter for his denial of Him during His passion and gave Peter another chance as His Apostle and the Rock on whom He would build His Church on earth. Through His obedience to His Father's will, in His suffering, death and resurrection, Jesus gave all of mankind another chance at life with God, by baptism into His Body. Jesus' resurrection from the dead has changed everything! It has changed our fundamental relationship with God. A relationship with God that Adam and Eve lost for all of mankind by disobedience.

In his first letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul says that if Christ has not been raised from the dead, our faith is in vain. If Christ has not been raised from the dead, we are still separated from God. If Christ had not risen from the dead, He has no more authority over our lives than any other historical person. But He did rise from the dead!

Now, Easter Sunday has dawned, and with it, the absolute victory of the Resurrection. The tomb is empty. The stone is overturned. The shadow of the cross is replaced by the morning light of a new life in truth. Christ's apparent failure has risen in victory.

We have another chance at life with God.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Spiritual Communion

Question:

What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?

Answer:

The practice of making a "spiritual communion" dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him." Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass, or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion.

Although the graces offered in spiritual communion are not the same as those offered in the sacramental communion of the Mass, this practice is still a powerful opportunity to express our desire for union with the Lord and to be united with Christ and the Church, even in an imperfect way.
