Sunday May 26, 2024 ~ The Most Holy Trinity

From the Bishop's Pen...

"Baptize them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Jesus told Phillip and the other Apostles, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father." Jesus is telling us that He does not just resemble His father, He is the exact image of His Father, and the Holy Spirit is the exact image of the Father and the Son. This is the Holy Trinity, this is God.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is that God is one, yet the one God exists in three individual and distinct Persons. God has only one nature, Divine, and each Divine Person, though individual and distinct, is wholly God with the same exact divine essence. What does that mean? It should not be a surprise if we do not understand the nature of God. St Augustine wrote: "What wonder is it you do not understand God? If you do understand, then it is not God." Only God can know Himself completely.

The Father is unbegotten, the Son is begotten by the Father, and the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son, yet each Divine Person has always existed. Each Person is distinct in their relationship to each other, each is the true, eternal God, yet there is only one God. We understand that three individual men are distinct from each other yet possess human nature in common. The unity of the three Divine Persons is altogether different. When we speak of them as one God, we mean not only that each is God, but that each is the ONE and same God.

At Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River, the three Persons of the Holy Trinity revealed themselves to us. In today's Gospel, there is no clearer statement that God is three Divine Persons in a Holy Trinity than when Jesus told His Apostles, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

God is love, therefore, the Holy Trinity is love and love, by its very nature, extends beyond itself. God did this in His creation, the universe and everything in it, especially His creation called man. His love extends to us to so great an extent that we are created in His image and likeness, given an immortal, rational soul with free will. Yet, while we were still sinners, the Father proved His self-giving love for us when He sent His Son to become what He was not, man. Jesus humbled Himself by becoming man, like us, but remains all that He was, God, without change. He died for our sins so that we could live, in His eternal love. Jesus told His Apostles, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." The Bible tells us that we are created in the image and likeness of God. Therefore, if the essence of God's nature is love, so is ours!

Deacons

Question:


Are you considering, becoming a deacon? How do you know if you have a vocation? What steps should you take next?

Answer:

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service.

If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!
