From the Bishop's Pen...

"Little girl, I say to you, arise!"

Each of the Gospel stories for the past several weeks have been about having faith in God. Saint Mark gives us two stories of faith in God, by faith in the One He sent, Jesus Christ. They are also stories of hope and of God's love for His people.

He gives us these stories in the form of a "Marcian Sandwich." The story of Jairus and his critically ill daughter is cut in half. Saint Mark creates his "Marcian Sandwich" by placing the "meat" of the story of the woman afflicted with hemorrhages in the middle of Jairus' story. Then he goes back to finish the story of Jairus' daughter. Saint Mark does this to show us that both stories are bound together as "one sandwich" in their outcomes.

Jairus had faith that Jesus loved and cared about his daughter, because he believed that merely touching her would be enough to cure her. As great as Jairus' faith was in Jesus to cure his daughter, I think the poor woman with the hemorrhages had even greater faith. She hoped that her cure came, not from Jesus touching her, but her touching only His garments.

We go back to Jairus, but now there is a difference in his faith in Jesus. Before, Jairus had faith that Jesus' touch was enough to cure his daughter. Jairus' servants have informed him that his daughter has died. Now, Jairus' faith has grown, because now he believes that Jesus' touch will raise his daughter from the dead!

Today, our love of our families and friends must compel us to turn to our faith in God. And we are compelled to put that faith into action. Just as Jairus and the poor woman reached out to Jesus, we must reach out to Jesus for His healing touch. We then must bring Jesus' love and healing to each other. As members of the Body of Christ, we must especially reach out to those most in need. We must let Jesus' healing touch come to others through us.



WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Face-to-Face Confession

Question:

In today's digital world, do we really need to be face-toface with a priest to confess our sins? Would Facetime or Zoom ever be allowed?

Answer:

The question of whether or not Catholics can celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation virtually (via social media, by phone, or in some other way) is a question that has actually been around for several years. The recent COVID-19 pandemic brought the question back in a new way, especially as many parishes were forced to introduce a sort of "social distanced" confession, with the sacrament being celebrated outdoors.

In reflecting on this question, however, there are a couple points that we want to keep in mind. First, as the Code of Canon Law observes in different places, the faithful have a right to the sacraments of the Church and the Church's ministers have a responsibility to make them accessible. At the same time, however, we always have to be sure that we respect the nature of the sacraments themselves.

Although modern forms of technology and communication can help us in our work of evangelization catechesis, the Pontifical Council for Social Communication has reminded us that, "Virtual reality is no substitute for the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, the sacramental reality of the other sacraments, and shared worship in a flesh and blood human community. There are no sacraments on the internet" (The Church and the Internet, no. 9). Although our encounters with others on the internet and via social media can be considered "real" in one sense, in the sacraments we encounter Christ in a personal and ecclesial way. It is never just a private experience but is always grounded in the life of the Church and this means that it must truly be personal, including the contact between the confessor and the penitent. While the convenience or ease of online celebrations might be appealing for many reasons, at heart, we always want to keep in mind the fullness of the Church's tradition and the meaning of the sacraments.
