Sunday August 4, 2024 ~ The Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Bishop's Pen...

"Whoever comes to me will never hunger, whoever believes in me will never thirst."

We eat but we are soon hungry again. That constant hunger was no different for the Israelites wandering in the desert than it is for us. God led them out of the slavery of Egypt and had continuously given the Israelites signs of His power. Through Moses, God told the Israelites, "Don't worry; I will take care of you. I will provide for all of your needs." Yet, as soon as they were hungry again, they forgot what God had done for them through Moses and wanted another sign.

The crowd of 5,000 kept following Jesus, because their physical hunger was fed, not because of the sign of HOW they were miraculously fed. They could not comprehend the "bigger picture." Jesus miraculously fed them as much as they wanted, showing them the sign of what He was really going to feed them with, Himself in the Eucharist. Jesus was telling the crowd what God told the Israelites through Moses, "Don't worry; I will take care of you. I will provide for all of your needs."

Earlier in John's Gospel, Jesus told the Samaritan woman at the well, of the life-giving water He offered. Unlike this crowd, the Samaritan woman believed in the sign Jesus told her about and became His disciple, bringing her village to also believe in Jesus. We are called to be like the Samaritan woman, seeking Jesus for the eternal life that He gives us in the food of the Eucharist. We are called to believe in Jesus and to follow Him, knowing that through our faith in Jesus, we now live in His eternal life, nourished by His Body and Blood in the Eucharist.

St Paul tells us that to be fed with the eternal life of the Eucharist means, "I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given Himself up for me." Our faith lets us hear Jesus say, "Don't worry, I will take care of you. I will make sure you have enough to eat." Our faith allows us to follow Jesus, as His disciples; carrying Him to everyone we meet, by sharing the love He gives us with one another.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Confession

Ouestion:

If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?

Answer:

Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like baptism or matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith!

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community – thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored.


