# Sunday August 25, 2024 ~ The Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Bishop's Pen...

"To whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

I would take one of my nephews to McDonald's when he was a little boy. I bought him a "happy meal." He believed that the whole meal was good and that there would be a reward, a toy, for him. He also believed that I knew what he should eat. When he saw something else that he thought he might want, he would ask me, "Do I like that?" What he was really saying at his young age, was that although he had a choice, his choice was to accept my choice for him. Yet as a teenager, he thought that he now knew what was best for himself.

Don't we, as adults, sometimes believe that we know what the best choices are for ourselves? By our choices, do we sometimes think that we even know better than God, what we should do and who we should follow? When we choose to follow our Lord, we cannot pick and choose what we want to believe as Catholics. In today's Gospel, Jesus' disciples must make a choice, and the choice is all or nothing at all. It is the same choice that each of us must make. That choice is hard!

Some of His disciples chose to leave Jesus, to live life as they saw it, not as He taught it. Jesus was teaching them that He alone is the Bread of Life and to have eternal life came only through Him. To gain that life, they had to eat His flesh and drink His blood. Those who walked away did not have faith. They did not understand Jesus' words, because of their lack of faith to believe in Him.

Do we believe that Jesus has the words of eternal life? Do we believe that we must eat His flesh and drink His blood to have eternal life? Do we believe that the Eucharist is really the Body and Blood of Christ? Our choice is simple, to choose God, like Peter, and to trust Him totally; or to trust only in ourselves. This choice is as old as man. We only need to look at the choice made by Adam and Eve.

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? **CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED**

#### FAITH IN MARRIAGE

#### Ouestion:

What kind of religious practices should we begin, once we marry, to help us practice our faith each day?

#### Answer:

Your spiritual life as a couple is important. The sacrament of Marriage is a gift and a grace, but living it well isn't always easy! It requires intentionality and perseverance. Growing your spiritual life as a couple also requires a plan. Life can be incredibly busy. There's never "enough time" for everything we want to do. But we can live by our priorities. If we don't prioritize prayer, we'll find it slowly disappear from our lives.

If you're not already praying individually, that's a good place to start. If your schedules are similar, take some quiet time at the same time to help hold each other accountable. Praying together is also important! You could start by looking at the religious practices of your family and of families around you that you respect. Talk with your spouse about the ones who make the deepest impression on you or were most meaningful when you were young. Think about what you want your future children to experience. Making faith a commitment now will mean it is an engrained habit when you grow your family. Ultimately, these faith practices should help us grow in our love for God and for one another.

#### **SACRAMENTS**

**Infant Baptisms:** Parents requesting baptism must be registered active members of the parish. A Catholic godparent must be a registered and practicing Catholic, confirmed in writing by his or her proper pastor. Baptisms are on the last Sunday of each month, after 12:00 pm Mass. Parents may pick up a Baptism Registration Packet from the church office during business hours. Participation in Pre-Baptismal Program is required.

**Marriage:** Couples seeking to be married in the church must make arrangements with the clergy six months to a year in advance of their intended wedding date to allow time for the couple to complete marriage preparation. At least one of the engaged must be a registered active member of this Church.

**Christian Burial:** The family of the registered deceased should notify the parish office as soon as possible or contact Mrs. Hawkins, Bereavement Committee Coordinator at etoile1706@aol.com to schedule the funeral planning meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Anointing of the sick is celebrated upon request prior to surgery or at the time of illness. Please notify the parish office of the illness or hospitalization of the parishioner.
