Sunday October 6, 2024 ~ The Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Bishop's Pen...

"Therefore, what God has joined together, let no human being separate."

Last week Jesus warned His disciples against envy of others and giving scandal to others. The week before, He warned His disciples against having selfish ambition. In all of these, our Lord makes the point that what we have been given by God is to be used to help one another.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the Pharisees how sacred the conjugal bond of matrimony between a man and a woman is. "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate."

In our reading from Genesis, Adam longs for someone to complement him, and God creates Eve, "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called 'woman,' for out of man this one has been taken." Just as God gives different gifts and talents to everyone, so that we can complement and help one another; He gave different bodies to man and woman, so that each may complement the other; thereby two become one flesh.

This joining together for the good of each other, and the pro-creation of children, is so important that the bride and bridegroom exchange their vows and marry each other. The priest or deacon does not marry them but receives their vows for the Church.

Today in the United States of America, what God, in His infinite wisdom has created; man in his finite folly, is continually trying to redefine, that is, God's meaning of marriage. This is truly a temptation of "self-fulfillment," "what I want, not what God wants for me," and it harkens to the previous two Sundays' Gospels.

None of us had a choice in who we are, but all of us have a choice in what we do. Each of us was created male or female, and we cannot change that. The choice we make must be to follow God's commandments, His moral and natural laws. A man and woman make the choice to follow God's commandment of self-giving love in exchanging their vows in marriage; to give themselves completely in love and service to one another, to become "one flesh" for the remainder of their earthly lives.

Each one of us must always make the choice in following Christ, to be obedient to the Father's commandments of love and service, whether married, single, religious, or God's ordained ministers.



The Hardness of Your Hearts

As far as I know, no one has ever woken up in the morning, looked out the window, and thought, "This is a beautiful sunrise. I'll have to be very careful not to let it make me happy."

But I'm certain that every day, lots of people — including, on not-infrequent occasions, myself — have woken up and remembered something that happened the day before. Something that made us feel upset or frustrated or insulted. And we thought to ourselves, "That makes me so, so angry." And we've pictured the face of the person who made us feel that way, and we have scoffed with disgust.


And we hold onto that anger because anger feels so much better than sadness. And deep within ourselves, in the place where we feel all the love and pain and confusion that is inherent in human existence, we harden.


Nobody ever intends to be hard-hearted. That's just the stuff of Bond villains and horror flicks. No, in real life a hardened heart isn't a conscious choice. It's a reflex. It's just us trying to protect ourselves, to be strong - or, at least, to embody the version of strength offered by a fallen world.

A heart of stone is not so easily scratched, you see. But it's also not so easily warmed or touched or moved. world.

A heart hardened by resentment and pain and anger is not just protected from injury. It is protected from the impact of the whole spectrum of tender feelings. It is not open to forgiveness, so it cannot feel the rush of life-giving mercy. It is closed off to new ideas, so it can never feel the awe of discovery.

There is a reason we are called to guard ourselves against hard-heartedness. God gave us hearts of flesh and blood. They are hearts that can be broken, yes — but also, they are hearts that can be made new.


