From the Bishop's Pen...

"Sell what you have and follow me."

"I prayed, and prudence was given me; I pleaded, and the spirit of Wisdom came to me." What is wisdom? Why would we want wisdom more than material wealth? Gaining wisdom is from God's grace. Gaining wisdom allows us to hear, understand and respond to God's call to each of us.

When the rich young man asks: "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus tells him to keep the Commandments. However, the Commandments that Jesus focuses on are those that deal with our relationships to each other. When the rich young man answers that he already keeps these Commandments, Jesus gives him one more thing to do. He tells him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

The Lord knows how wealthy or poor we are. He is asking us to give all we have, ourselves, not just our material wealth! Jesus is asking us, as he did the rich young man, to give ourselves totally to the service of each other. To sell all that we have, that also means me and you, to serve God by serving each other. He is asking us to have faith and to trust God, who is good. Jesus gave us the example of this "self-giving," by selling all that He had, Himself, when He died on the Cross to save our souls! He had faith and trusted in His heavenly Father and gave His life to free us from the bonds of sin and to gain eternal life for each of us.

Jesus calls us to give of ourselves in different ways. We need not be afraid to give of ourselves when we hear our Lord's call. The Lord that comes to us in the Eucharist is our strength. He will give us all that we need, so that we can give of ourselves, that is to love God above all else and to love our neighbor as God loves us. To sell what we have, ourselves, and give ourselves to each other and in doing that, we gain treasure in heaven, because we have come and followed Jesus.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

The Lord's Prayer

Question:

Why don't Catholics add the "For yours is the Kingdom ..." prayer at the end of the Our Father like Protestants do? Where did it come from?


Answer:

The conclusion of the Lord's Prayer that you refer to is called a doxology, which is a prayer of glory and praise. This particular doxology we do use in the Mass. After the Our Father, the priest prays the prayer that begins, "Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil..." and the people respond with the doxology. The doxology is not found in the Bible, but it is very ancient. It was first found in The Didache, also called "The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles," which dates probably from about the year AD 90. It was a letter of instruction to early converts to Christianity. Protestantism dates only to the sixteenth century, so the doxology is actually a Catholic prayer. Some scholars and the catechism (#2760) indicate that the doxology was connected to the celebration of the Eucharist and was not used apart from it.

Remember, both the Lord's Prayer and the Eucharist were part of the "mysteries of faith," things taught only to believers. Ironically, a remnant of a prayer used during the celebration of the Eucharist has comes to be used widely by many Christian churches that do not celebrate the Eucharist! Truth is indeed stranger than fiction!

The Mysteries of the Rosary

Have you ever wanted to explore the life of Jesus and Mary in a deeper way? Each decade highlights a sacred episode:

Joyful Mysteries: Through the Annunciation (1) and Visitation (2), we get a glimpse at Mary's joyful yes to God. She gives birth to Jesus in the Nativity (3). Mary and Joseph present their son at the temple (4) and bring him there again when he is a teenager (5).

Luminous Mysteries: Jesus is baptized in the Jordan River (1) before Mary gives him a nudge to his first miracle at Cana (2). Jesus proclaims the Gospel (3), is transfigured on Mount Tabor (4), and institutes the Eucharist (5). The light is shining!

Sorrowful Mysteries: Jesus prays in agony in Gethsemane (1), knowing his hour of suffering has come. After his betrayal and arrest, Jesus is scourged (2) and crowned with thorns (3). He carries his cross (4), and Mary stands at the foot of the cross as he is crucified (5).

Glorious Mysteries: Christ is risen in glory (1)! After appearing to those he loves, he ascends into heaven (2). Jesus' followers receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (3). Mary, unaffected by original sin, is assumed body and soul into heaven (4), where she is crowned queen, humble mother of Christ the King (5).
