From the Bishop's Pen...

"Master, I want to see."

"Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost, but now I'm found, was blind, but now I see." That song fits Bartimaeus, the blind beggar. He knew who Jesus was, so he called out to Him. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus knew his blindness was more than his eyesight, it was also his spiritual blindness.

Jesus asked Bartimaeus to tell Him what he wanted, as He asks us to tell Him what we want. We must recognize what it is that we lack the most, and then ask our loving and caring Lord, like Bartimaeus, for what we believe that we really need, not just what we want.

Beggars like Bartimaeus did not change the locations where they begged; they stayed in one place, so they could develop a regular clientele, people who came to know them and care for them over the years. Their dependency on material handouts immobilized them, preventing them from moving forward. When Bartimaeus threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus, he threw aside the chains of his own worldly fears and desires.

Bartimaeus responded to Jesus' presence from a depth with-in himself, and with a meaning which only Jesus knew. In Bartimaeus's heart there was a request to see more than simply with his eyesight. Bartimaeus wanted to see with the "eyes" of his soul. He came to recognize that truth, and so he asked Jesus for that gift of vision, the gift of that inner vision known as faith.

There are a lot of things that blind our souls to God's graces, pride, worldly possessions, and selfish desires. They are always the opposite of the fruits of the Holy Spirit. Like Bartimaeus, we need to call out to Jesus for His merciful help, "Master, I want to see."



WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

All Souls

Question:

November is called the month of All Souls. More recently, it has been called the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. Can you tell us more about this feast and the remembrances of this month?

Answer:

November 2, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, dovetails with November 1st, the feast of All Saints. The saints, our models of Christian living, are one with God in heaven. All the faithful departed are those who have died with hope and trust in a loving God who calls us to greater growth and development, even beyond death. This growth and development occurs in a state of being that we have traditionally called purgatory.

While the Western Church has emphasized the cleansing and purifying nature of purgatory, the Eastern Orthodox Church has emphasized the growth and development aspect of it. Today, belief in purgatory allows one who has died in Christ to continue growing and developing before meeting God face to face. God continually invites communion with these loved ones, but some feel the need to continue growing and developing before entering into full communion with God.

These November feasts vividly remind us of the rich reality known as the communion of saints. This belief stresses the strong affirmation that the church is always one in Christ. Death does not sever any of the bonds that unite us in Christ. That is why it is a fitting practice to pray for the dead and to ask them to pray for us. Just as we do that for each other when we are alive, so, too, do we continue that bond and concern for each other even beyond death.
