Sunday January 19, 2025 ~ The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Bishop's Pen...

"Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee."

Last Sunday we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord. The Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Spirit, revealed Itself to man at Jesus' baptism. Now Jesus is attending a wedding feast with His mother and the bridegroom has run out of wine for his guests.

Mary brings this to Jesus' attention, and He answers her rather strongly, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." Jesus is focused on doing His Father's will first but not objecting to fulfilling His mother's request. What Jesus will do next foretells what His Father's will is for Him, to bring us from the old law to His new Covenant of Love.

Jesus uses the 15 to 25 gallons of water in each of the six stone jars, meant for the old Jews ritual of purification and cleansing, and changes the water into what it was not, wine. Not only did He change water into wine, but into an abundance of the finest wine. This was an Old Testament prophetic sign of the Messiah that the Jews were waiting for.

God the Father spoke at Jesus' baptism, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." And now the Father has willed that Jesus begins to reveal Himself as the Messiah at this wedding feast in Cana.

Mary, with complete faith in her Son, turns to the servers and utters her last recorded words in the Bible, "Do whatever he tells you." Mary has the same message for us today, telling us how to follow her Son and have eternal life in Him, "Do whatever he tells you." When we obey Mary's command, we too, will be focused on doing our heavenly Father's will.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? **CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED**

Holy Days

Question:

Why do some dioceses move holy days, or not even celebrate them at all. Doesn't everyone do the same thing?

Answer:


The short answer is no, not everyone does the same thing. Although the church is universal, there are many local customs and saints that each country, sometimes just a region, will honor. For example, feast days and patronal days may not be major feast days on the church's universal calendar, but are celebrated as such in one place. Holy days of obligation are the same way. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops has a certain amount of discretion in choosing days which best reflect the local church's experience and history.

Another reason certain feasts are moved is a practical one. With limited clergy, or a great difficulty for people to get to Mass, the feast day may be transferred to a Sunday. The rationale is that if a significant feast should be part of the church's celebration, then better to do so on a Sunday when people and clergy are available, rather than try to fit it on a day when one or both cannot be there.

Christmas and Immaculate Conception are always observed as days of obligation. In the USA we celebrate six holy days of obligation. There are also other special days and they are ranked, in order of importance as solemnity, feast, memorial and optional memorial.
