From the Bishop's Pen...

"Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Have you watched the quiz show Jeopardy? Have you noticed the expressions of the contestants when they get the answer to what seems like an obvious question wrong? You can almost feel them wanting another chance to give the correct answer. Growing up, I used to hear my Godmother say, "Don't be a Doubting Thomas." I had no idea what that meant, or where the expression came from. Well, in today's Gospel, Thomas doubts that the Lord is truly risen. Not only is his Lord truly risen, but He will give Thomas another chance to believe.

Earlier in John's Gospel, as Jesus prepared to return to Judea, to raise His friend Lazarus from the dead, His disciples warned Him of the Jews' intention to kill Him. Thomas did not doubt what Jesus could do, and was full of confidence when he said, "Let us also go to die with him." Yet today Thomas is away when our Lord first appears to the other Apostles.

Thomas' confidence seems rooted in what he knows, what he has seen. Thomas is full of false confidence, and lacking faith, because he doubted that Jesus had risen from the dead when his fellow Apostles told him that Jesus had appeared to them. Thomas doubted his faith, because he had not seen Jesus, himself. "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

When Jesus appeared to the Apostles again, He brought His lost sheep, Thomas, back to His flock when He said, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas again believed saying, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus gave Thomas another chance to have faith in Him, to profess that faith and to live that faith for the rest of his life.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday and Jesus calls us not to be like "Doubting Thomas." If we believe in the miracles He did in the Scriptures, then we should believe in the mercy of His miracles (big & small) that He performs in our lives every day. When we have doubt, Jesus says to us, do not be unbelieving, but believe in my Divine Mercy. We take advantage of His Divine Mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. When we leave that Sacrament, we believe that we have received God's mercy.

Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us that God not only wants us to receive His mercy, but to also show mercy to others. In fact, we must forgive others for us to be forgiven! Jesus taught us that in The Lord's Prayer, "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." Let us always be willing to forgive, as God is always willing to forgive us.

Inspiration for the Week

Questions of the Week - for Your Reflection

1st Reading Question:

In the aftermath of Jesus' resurrection, the Apostles performed "many signs and wonders," healing the sick and exorcising unclean spirits. Is there something in your life that needs healing?

2nd Reading Question:

John is initially frightened at the strange vision of Jesus, but Jesus reassures him, "Do not be afraid." How does Jesus calm your fears?

Gospel Question:

The resurrected Jesus' first words to his disciples are "Peace be with you." How could you be a peacemaker this week with a family member or neighbor?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Discernment

Ouestion:

How do I discern if a call to do something big is really from God?

Answer:

Each day we face plenty of decisions about following God: whether or not to pray, how to treat people, and how to prioritize our time. Sometimes there can be something much more significant we discern: a vocational call, a promotion at work that requires a move, or a new ministry position at church. In addition to a pro-con list or a cost-benefit analysis, here are a few things to prayerfully consider and to talk over with trusted individuals.

Does it conform to God's will revealed in the Church? God doesn't call us to do something that contradicts the moral law. Will it encourage spiritual growth? Sometimes we need to choose between multiple good options. Consider the personal impact on you and others you are responsible for, like family. Other times we might be invited to do good for others, but when we assess our other life commitments, we see that saying yes to this would actually impede our prior responsibilities in the long run. Does the call seem consistent? This isn't to say that God won't do something new. Even so, consider if the call is consistent with your gifts and abilities. Can you see a "through-line" so to speak, with how your experiences have led you to this point? Do others confirm it? Share your reflections with trusted, insightful confidantes. Have they seen the same things you have, or are they bringing up new points to consider? Humbly add their relevant points to your considerations. Don't forget your gut. After you've carefully considered everything in your mind, don't neglect your instincts. Does your heart say yes or no?
