From the Bishop's Pen...

"The Holy Spirit will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

Jesus said: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." In one sentence, Jesus tells His disciples what He expects of them and what will happen when they follow His commands.

He assures them that they have nothing to fear and why they should be happy that even though He is returning to the Father, Jesus and the Father will come to dwell in them, because He is not going to leave them alone. The disciples believed Jesus, because He had given them a peace that the world could not give them. He had given them a peace that overcame their fear.

Jesus said to His disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." That type of peace comes when we trust Jesus completely, without fear.

Just before today's Gospel passage, Jesus told His disciples, "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, which the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows it. But you know it, because it remains with you, and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you."

By our Baptisms, we have become members in the one Body of Christ. "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, is one body, so also Christ." All the members form one body, which with its Head is the Son of Man, who is the Son of God, who Himself with the Father and Holy Spirit, is one God. Therefore, each of us, by our Baptism into Christ, has come to share, through adoption, in the very nature of God.

Our unity in the one Body of Christ gives us the peace that allows us to always rejoice. Next weekend we will rejoice in celebrating the Ascension of our Lord into heaven. Jesus' return to His Father is our hope, our joy, it is the peace of knowing that now, we too can come to the Father through Jesus.

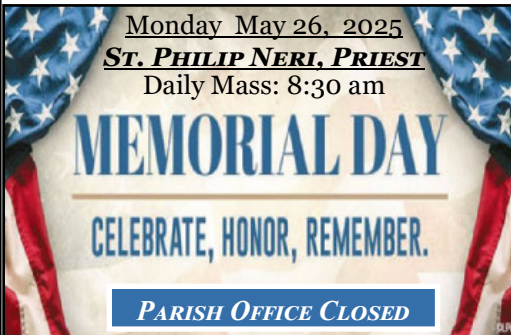

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Sunday Mass

Question:

Why do Catholics need to go to Mass every Sunday?

Answer:

The heart of the Church's instruction that we are to attend Mass on Sundays goes back to the Third Commandment: "Take care to keep holy the sabbath day as the LORD, your God, has commanded you" (Deuteronomy 5:12). Although the Jewish People celebrate the Sabbath on Saturday, the first generations of Christians began to observe the sabbath on Sunday, recognizing how important it is for Christians to celebrate the day that Jesus rose from the dead. As the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults observes, "Sunday extends the celebration of Easter throughout the year ... It makes present the new creation brought about by Christ" (364).

The focus of our Sunday should be the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass. This is our time to be formed by God's Word and nourished at the table of the Lord, becoming prepared to live out and share our faith in the week that follows. In his encyclical, *Dies Domini*, Pope Saint John Paul II reminded us that Christians "cannot live their faith or share fully in the life of the Christian community unless they take part regularly in the Sunday Eucharistic assembly" (no. 81). This is why the Church teaches us that Sunday Mass is a non-negotiable part of being a Christian (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2192).

Sunday is given as a day to take stock of and enjoy the blessings that God has given us (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2187). Pope Francis reminded us, “The day of rest, centered on the Eucharist, sheds its light on the whole week, and motivates us to greater concern for nature and the poor” (Laudato Si’, no. 237).

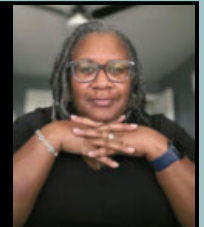

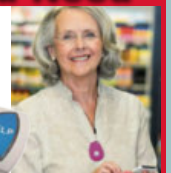
