From the Bishop's Pen...

"As the Father sent me, so I send you: Receive the Holy Spirit."

Today, we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the Birthday of the Church. We need to realize what Jesus gave us by sending His Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, and truly upon us, on the day of Pentecost. In the Old Testament, Samuel prophesied, saying "The spirit of the LORD will rush upon you, and you will join them in their prophetic state and will be changed into another man." The Apostles were truly changed into new men when the Holy Spirit came upon them as "tongues of fire," Baptizing them in fire and truth in the Upper Room.

On the day of Pentecost, they started to act as the Apostles that Jesus chose them to be. "On the day of Pentecost, the Apostles were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." The Church began to evangelize in a spectacular display of power by the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity.

The Holy Spirit, who came into the lives of the Apostles in such a big way, is the same Holy Spirit that still comes into our lives today. The Holy Spirit operates in each of our lives through His fruits or gifts of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, mildness, chastity, and faithfulness. The Holy Spirit works in us and through us.

In our Gospel from the Vigil of Pentecost, Jesus said: "Whoever believes in me, as scripture says: 'Rivers of living water will flow from within him.' He said this in reference to the Spirit that those who came to believe in him were to receive." That "living water" is the Holy Spirit. Through our Baptism and strengthened in our Confirmation, the gifts of the Holy Spirit will flow from within us like a river, so that we can love and serve God, by loving and serving each other.

The river of the Holy Spirit's gifts causes us to change, to become more like Christ, whose Body we are now a part of. We do not always know how the Holy Spirit will work in us and through us. But we always know through our faith in Jesus, that the Holy Spirit will work in us and through us, to change us and others. This change opens us to "a freedom which enables us to live as Jesus calls us to live, so that we will rejoice always, in doing God's will."

Why Use Incense?

Question:

Why do we use incense at Mass?

Answer:

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church’s liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, “Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering” (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).

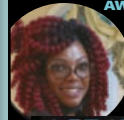

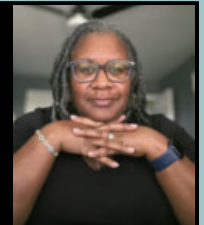

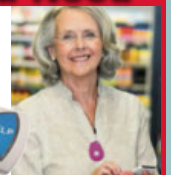
