From the Bishop's Pen...

"You are Peter, and I will give you the keys to the Kingdom of heaven."

We hear in our Gospel that Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Jesus offers Peter a public opportunity to profess repentance through love. This is a marvelous example of what it is that re-establishes our relationship with God, after sin. We confess our repentance for our sins in the confessional, in our Act of Contrition, to Jesus' representative, the priest. We are then ready to receive Jesus' love by His forgiving our sins against Him, and His grace to avoid committing more sins.

In our Second Reading, we hear Saint Paul say: "For you heard of my former way of life in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God beyond measure and tried to destroy it." Paul showed his repentance by immediately accepting God's will, through Jesus' call (why he is considered an Apostle) and put his conversion in the faith into action by His deeds.

We also heard how Peter put his faith into action by using the gifts of healing and love that Jesus bestowed on him with the paralytic at the Temple: Peter said, "I have neither silver nor gold, but what I do have I give you: in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean, rise and walk."

Both Peter and Paul continued to spread the love of Jesus, through the Gospel, to all they encountered, ending up together in Rome and shedding their blood for Christ, as He had shed His blood for them, and us.

Each of us are called by the same Lord who called Saints Peter and Paul to enter the love of His forgiveness by confessing our sins, what we have done, and what we have failed to do, by asking God for His forgiveness and grace. Then, we are to go and bring others to Christ by freely giving of ourselves, using the gifts God gives us, to help one another.

Pilgrimage


A pilgrimage is a journey to a place of spiritual significance undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

When the time came for the Transfiguration of Christ, Jesus took three of his disciples to "a high mountain by themselves," indicating that the sacred mysteriousness of this moment was something best experienced apart from the routine of ordinary life. This is the principle behind the act of pilgrimage: a journey to a place of spiritual significance, undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

Christian pilgrimages really began in the fourth century, when churches in the Holy Land were constructed in locations associated with the life of Christ. Throughout the centuries, pilgrims have likewise flocked to sites of Marian apparitions, miracles, and to places connected with the lives of saints. Some of the most iconic pilgrimage destinations include Fatima, Lourdes, and the Santiago de Compostela in Spain.
