## From the Bishop's Pen...

"You also must be prepared."

When I was in my twenties, I would play football most Sundays during the fall with a group of other young men. We were friends who grew up together and knew each other. When I played the quarterback position, I would tell my receivers in the 'huddle' what routes to run. When they made their final 'cut,' I would have already thrown the ball to where they would be when they turned around to catch it. My receivers had faith in me and believed that I would do what I promised them I would do in the 'huddle,' because they had seen me do it before. I had the same faith in them to do as they were asked.

When it comes to believing in God's promises, we are called to have an infinitely greater faith. This is the type of faith that Abraham had in God. At God's call, Abraham left the only land that he knew, to go where God told him to go, even though he did not know where he was going. When God called Abraham, he was an old man and his wife, Sarah, was an old woman. They had no children of their own, yet they had faith in God and believed that from them would come "descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky."

Abraham and Sarah had a son, Isaac, and through faith in the God he had never seen, Abraham was prepared to obediently sacrifice his son at God's command. We know the end of this story. God would not let Abraham harm Isaac, because of Abraham's faith and obedience. Isaac became the father of Jacob. Jacob, called Israel by God, was the father of twelve sons. Jacob's sons became the heads of the twelve tribes of Israel. Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob all died with complete faith in the God they had never seen.

We must have the same complete faith in a God we know, through Jesus Christ, though we too, have never seen Him. Jesus tells us in His parables that our faith must be put into action. Through faith, we must always be prepared to answer God's call in this life, whether He calls us to a particular vocation, or He calls us into eternal life. God entrusts us with our faith and His love, to do as He asks, to spread our faith and His love, to those who do not have faith.

When we are always prepared to live in the faith and love that God has given us, Jesus will gird Himself, have us recline at table, and proceed to wait on us, in the kingdom of heaven.

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? **CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED**

#### **Parish Registration**

#### **Question:**

Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

#### **Answer:**

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

#### House Blessings...

Catholics who move to a new place of residence often wish to have their dwelling blessed, to call the favor and help of God upon all those who live in the house and all those who will enter it.

The Roman Ritual (Book of Blessings) provides two formats for house blessings: one during the Easter or Christmas season (specifically for the Epiphany) and one for Ordinary Time. Those who live in the home must be present for a house to be blessed. A priest, deacon or lay person can administer the blessing, although if a lay person does so they must use the rites accorded to lay ministers in the Roman Ritual.

A house blessing includes Scripture readings, intercessions and a prayer of blessing.
