From the Bishop's Pen...

"By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

After Jesus' resurrection and ascension into heaven, many Christians believed that His Second Coming, or "Parousia," was imminent. The Thessalonians were among those who thought that Christ was coming again very soon. Rather than continuing to live as true Christians the way Saint Paul had taught them, they stopped trying. They thought, why bother since Christ is coming soon? The Thessalonians concentrated on things that were not preparing them for the kingdom of God, like being noseys, or busybodies. They had become disorderly and would not work or help each other.

Saint Paul tells the Thessalonians to imitate him, by continuing to do the things he did, to live as the Gospel of Christ calls each Christian to live, in love and service of God and love and service of each other. In other words, to concentrate on what is really important to enter the kingdom of heaven.

In our Gospel, Jesus tells those around Him, and us, about the "end times" that are coming; however, we do not know when the end will come. We do not know when the end of the world will come, just as we do not know when our own "end" or mortal death will come. Jesus told those who placed their values in earthly objects that these objects would not last; therefore, these objects should not be the focus of their attention.

Jesus is telling us, the sheep of His flock, the same thing, not to put our trust in material possessions. We already have powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues in our world that Jesus said would precede the "end of time." However, we cannot spend our time speculating on when the "end of time" will come. Jesus tells us not to put our trust in "false prophets." They use these and other events to lead His sheep away from living the Gospel of Christ as true Christians. If we put our trust in "false prophets," we will not be prepared for the "end" when it does come.

Since none of us knows when the "end of time" for the world is to come, or when the "end" for each of us is to come, we must live as Jesus taught us in the Lord's Prayer. "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, **your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.**" This is how we prepare for our "end" and the "end of time."

Calling Priests Father

Question:

Why do Catholics call priests Father?

Answer:

One of the common objections evangelical Christians have to Catholics is our practice of calling priests by the title Father. They will often cite a passage in Matthew’s Gospel in which Jesus tells his followers: “Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven” (23:19). It seems pretty straightforward, but when we put this verse in context, we see that Jesus is speaking out against religious leaders who had forgotten what their proper role was and who were bad examples through their own hypocrisy and elitist attitudes.

In other Gospels, we find Jesus himself using the title father for different characters, such as in the Parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man (Luke 16:19-31) and the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). If we put the verse from Matthew into the full scope of Jesus’ teachings, he isn’t saying that we can’t use words like “father,” “rabbi,” or “master.” Rather, he is telling us that we should be mindful of the full meaning of those titles and not to misuse them.

To call a priest "Father" is more than a sign of respect for the office of the priesthood. It goes all the way back to the way St. Paul understood his own work as a missionary and evangelizer. Paul wrote, "I am writing you in this way not to shame you but to admonish you as my beloved children ... It was I who begot you in Christ Jesus through my preaching of the Gospel. I beg you, then, be imitators of me. This is why I have sent you Timothy, my beloved and faithful son in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 4:14-17).

Yes, we have God alone as our heavenly Father, but there are also those here with us who nurture and nourish our faith through their teaching and care. This is why the title of Father has been applied to the church's pastors in different ways since the earliest days of the Church, including monks and nuns using the title "abbot" and "abbess" (from abba) for their spiritual leaders and Christians around the world recognizing the "Holy Father" or "pope" (from papa) as the head of the family that is the Church. The title Father is a reminder that priests have a special responsibility to care for, protect, feed, listen to, and nourish those who have been entrusted to them, all after the example of our Father in heaven who never ceases to give us what we truly need.

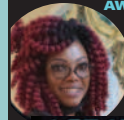
