From the Bishop's Pen...

"Stay awake, that you may be prepared!"

Jesus told His disciples in our Gospel, "If the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Noah did not know the hour the rain and flood would come, but he listened to the Lord and was prepared for the unexpected flooding of the earth for 40 days and nights. Others did not listen or look for the signs around them and were not prepared for the coming flood. They continued living their sinful lives and paid the price for not being prepared. They did not survive the flood waters. Jesus tells us that the Son of Man will come in the same way as the flood waters came in Noah's time, un-expectantly. If we are not prepared, we will be swept away to suffer with all the others who were not prepared.

We do not know when we will be coming to the end of our time on earth, and we will be called home to our Father's house. This is what we are preparing for! Today is the First Sunday of Advent. It is also the first Sunday of the rest of our lives. The Church is preparing for Christmas. We have lit the 1st Advent candle, preparing for the coming of Christ, the eternal light who will pierce the darkness of the world. Each of us should also be preparing for Christ's coming into our individual lives.

God wants us to know that our time is limited and that our lives and history itself will come to an end. He wants us to use our limited time wisely, living as true Christians. Jesus considers this lesson to be so important that He gives four separate parables in the Gospel, to drive the lesson home to His disciples. Jesus knew how easily even the most faithful disciple can fall into the trap of thinking that this earthly life is the goal and not merely the path.

At Christmas, we celebrate Christ's coming on earth. We should also be preparing for His coming for each of us individually, so that each of us can be prepared for eternal life in His Father's house. Jesus was born at Christmas to share in our humanity, and to free us from our human sins, so that we can be prepared to share in His divinity for eternity.

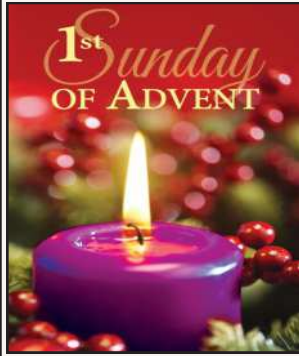

"You do not know on which day your Lord will come," Jesus says. He is reminding us that we do not know the mind of God. But we do know the heart of God, and we know that it is filled with mercy for those who heed the warning: Stay awake!

Questions of the Week - for Your Reflection

1st Reading Question:

The prophet Isaiah envisioned a future with no more wars and nations united in belief and worship of Israel's God.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Strike our Chest: Penitential Act

Question:

When we say the Penitential Act at Mass, why do we strike our chest three times?

Answer:

Our rituals and liturgical celebrations are filled with a variety of symbols, some of which also relate to our gestures and physical postures (e.g. kneeling, sitting, processing, making the Sign of the Cross). The custom of striking our breast three times during the "I Confess" of the Penitential Act of the Mass is one of those gestures that is loaded with symbolism.

The tradition of Christian's striking the breast (above the heart) is rooted in the image of Sacred Scripture, especially texts like Psalm 51 which speak of a "humbled contrite heart" or how God heals broken hearts, binding up our wounds (see Psalm 147:3). Early Christian writers like Saint Augustine of Hippo and Saint Jerome also refer to this custom in their writings.

Ultimately, this practice is an expression of our sorrow for those times when we have been guilty of faults and a sign that we are willing to take responsibility for our sins and failings. That we all perform this gesture together is also an act of solidarity, recognizing that none of us, regardless of where we are on our journey of faith, is without fault and the need for grace and forgiveness.

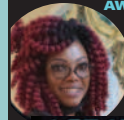
