From the Bishop's Pen...

“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!”

God sent John the Baptist to call the Jews to prepare for our Lord's coming, “Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.” “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!” Many who came to John were sincerely sorry for straying into the chaos of sin. They acknowledged their sins and John baptized them with water as a sign of their repentance, their change of heart.

By his own life and actions, John lived the conversion of heart that he called others to live. John's baptism of repentance was preparing those contrite Jews for the One who will baptize them with the “Holy Spirit and fire.” Repentance calls for a change of heart and how one lives their life, a turning of one's life from rebellion to obedience to God.

Not everyone who heard John's message of repentance and came to him was sincerely sorry for their sins. They did not have a true conversion of heart. These included many Pharisees and Sadducees, the religious leaders of the Jews. They would not accept a baptism of repentance. To do so would mean their admission that they too were sinners, not the “self-righteous” people they pretended to be. John knew them for who they really were, hypocrites! Their outward show did not match what was in their hearts! They were only giving “lip service” to John's message of repentance.

That is why John said to them “You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance.” That is our Gospel's message for us today. “Produce good fruit as evidence of our repentance.” When we sincerely pray to God for forgiveness, true repentance means that we change the way we live. It means that we are truly ready for Christ's coming in our lives.

When we sincerely ask for forgiveness of our sins, we prepare ourselves for Christ's coming at Christmas and His “Second Coming” by “making straight the way of the Lord” in our lives. When we sincerely ask for forgiveness of our sins, God's forgiveness strengthens us to be able to forgive others and help them to prepare for the coming of Christ. When we repent, and open our hearts, God can give us His graces and we will be prepared when Jesus comes again!



INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

The story of Advent is a story of repentance. John the Baptist held up a mirror to the chosen people. He urged them to look at what they saw there. This Advent, will we look in the mirror? Will we choose repentance?

Questions of the Week - for Your Reflection

1st Reading Question:

Isaiah foresaw God's future when the world will be ruled by a new and ideal 'King David' ("a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse") and the earth will be filled with knowledge of the Lord. **What do you hope for in your future?**

2nd Reading Question:

Paul encouraged the community of believers in Rome to be in harmony with each other in thought and mind.

Gospel Question:

John the Baptist taught the people to prepare for the kingdom of heaven by repenting of sins and producing "good fruit."

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Immaculate Conception

Question:

I've heard people call Jesus' conception by the Holy Spirit being "immaculately conceived." Is that what the Immaculate Conception is?

Answer:

While these two events are often confused, they are not the same thing. We celebrated the conception of Jesus on March 25th, the feast of the Annunciation. While that was surely miraculous, it isn't what we refer to as the "immaculate conception." The Immaculate Conception is Mary's conception, and we typically celebrate it on December 8th. If the 8th happens to be a Sunday, the Church moves the feast to December 9th. It is a holy day of obligation. Why does the Church consider it so important to celebrate?

Mary's conception is immaculate because she was conceived without original sin. The angel Gabriel acknowledges this when he hails Mary as "full of grace" (Luke 1:28). Scripture scholars identify several theological ideas that confirm this. In the Old Testament, the sacred, pristine Ark of the Covenant held the presence of God. The presence of God is now held within a new "arc" — the womb of Mary. Genesis 3 also prophesies of a woman who would oppose the devil and whose child would crush the devil's head. Christ is the "New Adam." This passage sets up Mary, then, as the "New Eve." Jesus and Mary are the beginnings of a new creation, one we all can participate in through the grace of our baptism. After all, God's love is more "original" than our sin!

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE *Blessed Virgin Mary*

"Immaculate Mary, your praises we sing!" December 8th is one of our feasts celebrating Mary - the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. From the beginnings of the Church, spiritual writers and theologians have acknowledged the innocence and holiness of Mary. St. Irenaeus called her the "new Eve." Both faced with the pure freedom to accept or reject God, Mary began with work of redemption with her yes to Christ! The Church began to celebrate the feast of Mary's conception in the early Middle Ages. In 1854, Pope Pius IX infallibly declared that Mary was free of original sin from the first moment of her conception. On this feast day, we celebrate the beauty and goodness of Our Lady!
