**THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH**

**From the Bishop's Pen...**

**"Take the child and his mother and flee into Egypt."**

We know from last Sunday's Gospel that Joseph was open to hearing God and to being obedient to His commands; therefore, it is not surprising that Joseph did exactly what the angel told him to do in a dream, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him." Joseph was intent on providing for and protecting his wife and his foster Son.

In keeping with Jewish custom, Joseph named the boy Jesus (which means Savior), taught Him how to pray, how to work, and how to be a man. When the 12-year-old Jesus stayed behind in the Temple in Jerusalem, Joseph, along with Mary, searched with great anxiety for Him for three days. This is what a parent does for a child.

What is it in a family that a child is supposed to do for his or her parents? Our reading from the Book of Sirach tells us of the graces and benefits that come to children who obey the Fourth Commandment, "Honor your father and mother." Children are called to respect their parents and everyone in their family. It is not difficult to see that this love of parents and family is extended in Christ's Second Great Commandment – "love thy neighbor as thyself."

Sirach tells us what a child who obeys this commandment of love accomplishes in God's eyes. "He who honors his father atones for sins; he stores up riches who reveres his mother. He who honors his father is gladdened by children, and when he prays he is heard. He who reveres his father will live a long life; he obeys the LORD who brings comfort to his mother. He who fears the LORD honors his father, and serves his parents as rulers. My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate with him; revile him not in the fullness of your strength. For kindness to a father will not be forgotten, it will serve as a sin offering – it will take lasting root." It is in our family homes that we learn this philosophy of life. It is there that we acquire principles by which we should live and relate to others.

Each of us wrestles with identity issues, while at the same time embracing responsibilities toward our family. Every parent wrestles with freedom issues for their child, while at the same time cooperating with God, trusting that their child is being protected. It is a delicate balance; and one that Mary and Joseph must have learned together with Jesus. Let us pray for all families this weekend that this balance may be found, so that as families, we will always grow spirituality, in our love and trust in God, and in our love and trust in each other.

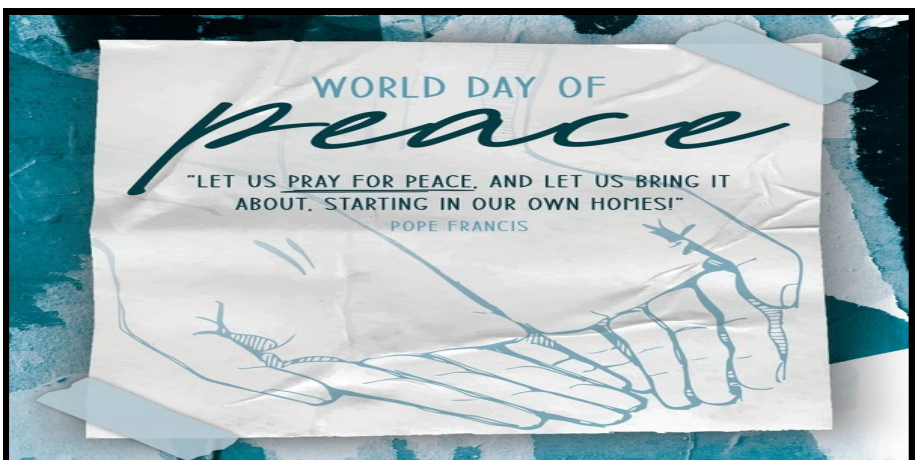

**Confessing Sins**

**Question:**

If I go to the Sacrament of Penance and end up repeating the same sins, does that mean I do not have a strong enough intention to amend my life?

**Answer:**

There is a popular expression that says, “Be patient. God isn’t finished with me yet!” Growing in faith and holiness is an ongoing, life-long project, and our struggle with sin is at the heart of it. As St. Paul says, the good he intends to do, he does not do. The evil he does not intend, he does! It is not always a lack of intention, but more often the allure of evil that makes it difficult to change.

When we confess our sins, we are to come with a fully contrite heart. You need to reflect on your true feelings toward your actions before approaching the sacrament. After confession, there are strategies you can make to avoid falling into the same traps of sin. First, pray for and seek out strength and perseverance through multiple sacraments, charitable work, and personal sacrifice. Second, avoid occasions of sin when you might fail or be sorely tempted. In doing these things, remind yourself daily that it is a spiritual war we wage, and with God’s grace, we will succeed.
