**From the Bishop's Pen...**

*"Now it has been revealed that the Gentiles are coheirs of the promise."*

## **The Pastor's Thoughts!**

"Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." The magi followed a star that led them to Bethlehem, to the splendor of Jerusalem, the Light of the world, the baby Jesus.

Astronomers have presented different theories throughout the centuries as to what type of celestial event "caused" the "star" that the magi followed. Was it an alignment of the planets Jupiter and Venus, or a super nova (exploding star) from a neighboring galaxy? What happened was that God commanded the universe He created, whether to align planets or stars, to announce to the world that its Savior had been born. The Magi symbolized the coming of God to the Gentiles, God's Epiphany (Revelation) to the whole world, in all its history.

The Epiphany of Christ to the magi is also about faith. The magi were court astrologers of kings, who studied the stars and knew of the Hebrew prophesy of the birth of a King, from the Old Testament. The light of the "star" led the magi to the Light that had come into our world. The King that the magi came to see is the Light that the darkness of the world will not overcome.

The reality of our Christian religion is that God reveals Himself to us. God comes to us; He makes Himself known to us in our humanity, in Jesus Christ. It is fundamental to Christian belief that God entered our human condition to be in close communion with us. From Adam and Eve until now, it is God who comes to search us out.

Epiphany tells us that God has decided to come to us where we are, as we are. We should be concerned with our vision of God. The Church wants us to see the Light of the World, to see things in God's Light as He presents Himself to us in our lives.

Today let us become the magi who followed Bethlehem's star to the birthplace of the Son of David. Today let us renew once again our commitment to see God's Light in our lives. Today let us see God's Light together, in His beloved Son, born as one of us to become one with us, so that we can become one in Him.

**I prayerfully ask the Light of World that each of us has a holy and Blessed Epiphany!**

**INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK**

The journey of the Magi reflects how treacherous our Christian life on earth can be. Always, evil works against us — Satan lays traps. He sows confusion. May we, like the Magi, recognize the will of God as our guiding star.

**WHY DO WE DO THAT?**

**CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED**

***The Three Wise Men***

**Question:**

Magi, Three Kings, Three Wise Men...who were they?

**Answer:**

We sing songs, give gifts, and move three mysterious men into our manger scenes. There's a rich heritage in the Catholic Church of celebrating the magi, but their origins are steeped in mystery. The original Greek calls these men *magoi*. The word is translated elsewhere in Scripture to mean "magician," but a similar word was used in ancient history to describe an entirely different set of people altogether. In what is now modern-day Iran, the ruling empire had a wealthy priestly caste known as the Magi. At the time of Christ, the Magi formed one of the ruling councils of the Parthian Empire. These priests interpreted dreams and read the stars to anticipate major events that could affect the fortunes of the empire.

We're not exactly sure where the magi of the Gospels traveled from. Matthew simply says "the east." History tells us that the ancient regions of Persia, Assyria, and Babylon all had a magi priesthood at the time of Christ. Whichever region they hailed from, they likely traveled over one thousand miles over the course of several months to arrive at the Holy Family. Unfortunately for the classic song, there is no concrete evidence these men were themselves kings, though they did bear gifts "from afar" at the prompting of their astronomical calculations.

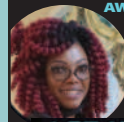

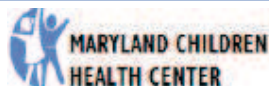
