## SUNDAY JANUARY 18, 2026 THE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*From the Bishop's Pen...*

*"Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."*

John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him at the Jordan River and said, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. He is the one who is coming after me, who ranks ahead of me, because he existed before me." John realized that he was the humble servant who was preparing the way of the Lord. He was called to proclaim our Lord's coming and to prepare Israel for His coming by a baptism of repentance. John knew his role was as a servant of God. John was to baptize with water so that Israel would be prepared for the One who was to come and baptize with the Holy Spirit. He also knew that Jesus was not only the SERVANT of God, but the Son of God.

Isaiah prophesies about the SERVANT of God and we see that He will be the Light to the nations. From Isaiah's prophesy we see that God's SERVANT will be sent not just to redeem Israel from its sins, but to free the whole world from its bondage to sin and death.

We are all baptized into the life of Christ, the SERVANT of God, and we are called to spread the good news of the Gospel of Christ to all. However, to fulfill our calling in Christ, we, like John the Baptist, must know our roles as servants of God. Do we know that to carry out our roles, we are dependent on God? Do we know that what we want must decrease so that the proper place of Jesus in our lives may increase? Are we as clear about our roles as John the Baptist was about his?

John the Baptist did not shy away from making clear distinctions between Jesus and himself in today's Gospel. Neither should we. We must always remember our relationship to Jesus and make the necessary preparations in our own lives to make straight the way of the Lord.

In short, we must move from independence in our own lives, to dependence upon Jesus in the life of Christ.

Do we recognize Christ when we see him? Do we have the courage to point him out, to show others who he is? John cried out so the whole world could hear: "He is the Son of God." Always and everywhere, let us do the same

**WHY DO WE DO THAT?**

**CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED**

**Instructions on Receiving Communion**

**Question:**

How many times a day can a person receive communion?

**Answer:**

To find an answer to this question, we need to turn to the Church's Code of Canon Law. Here we read, "One who has received the blessed Eucharist may receive it again on the same day only within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates ..." (no. 917). This tells us that the standard answer would be that we can receive communion twice in a day.

Having said that, we also want to be sure that we pay attention to the entire instruction. The phrase "within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates" is important. It means a) that we always have to think of receiving communion as being within a celebration of the Mass and b) we have to be participants in that celebration – we can't simply show up "in time" for communion.

So, when would this rule apply?

For example, if you attend Mass on a Saturday morning and then take part in the Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday evening, you could licitly receive communion at both celebrations. Or, another example, if you receive communion at a wedding or funeral Mass, you could also receive communion at a daily Mass or Sunday Vigil celebrated on the same day. We always want to be sure that we observe the rules for fasting from food and drink before receiving the eucharist (see Code of Canon Law, no. 919).

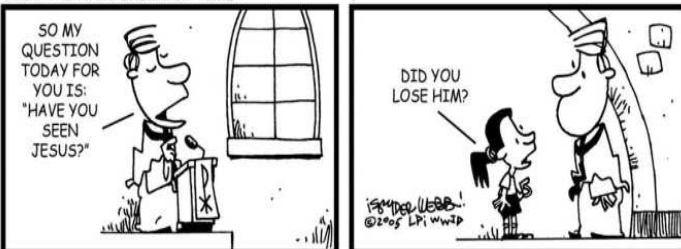

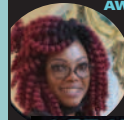

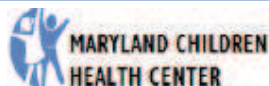
