From the Bishop's Pen...

"Blessed are the poor in spirit."

In today's Gospel, when Jesus "saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to teach them..." It is not by chance that Jesus went up the mountain to teach His disciples and the crowds. Moses went up the mountain of Sinai to receive the "Ten Commandments" from God. The "Ten Commandments," given to the Israelites, contained God's Covenant with His chosen people, a Covenant of freedom from slavery and death in Egypt.

We probably picture Moses coming down Mount Sinai holding two tablets, each with "Five" of the Commandments. Those tablets represented God's Covenant with His people, so each tablet contained the complete "Ten Commandments." One tablet was God's part of the Covenant, and the other tablet was the Israelites' part of the Covenant. Guess which side broke their part of the Covenant?

Jesus, on this mountainside, tells His chosen people, in fact, all people, including you and me, how to live in His New Covenant, a Covenant of freedom from slavery to sin and eternal death, a Covenant of love and life. This time the Covenant between God and man will not be broken, because it is between Jesus and His Church, sealed with His own blood, shed on the Cross.

The Beatitudes that Jesus gives us turns this world's standards upside down. Jesus tells us that God gives us happiness; we cannot win it, achieve it, merit it, or buy it. Jesus teaches the crowds, and us, that happiness will come to people with open hands, humble hearts, and receptive spirits.

Jesus not only tells us in the Beatitudes how we are to live our lives, but what blessings and hope this living brings us. To live humbly in righteousness is the hope that we should have, that when our earthly journey is complete, we will be truly blessed to hear the words of our Lord, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."

A little humility goes a long way because it gives us eternal hope. "Blessed are the poor in spirit – theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Blessed are the poor, the meek, the persecuted. These are radical words in a world that insists the opposite: blessed are the wealthy. Blessed are the forceful. Blessed are the comfortable. Do we have what it takes to be radical?

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Vocation or Calling

Question:

Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?

Answer:

A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED!

St. Blaise Blessing of the Throat

Perhaps it's an example of divine providence that the feast of St. Blaise falls on Feb. 3 — right in the middle of cold and flu season! This fourth-century Armenian saint was a bishop and martyr and is venerated as the patron of those who suffer from illnesses of the throat.

On his feast day, Catholics traditionally receive a blessing of the throat. This blessing is administered by a priest, deacon or a lay minister who follows the rites and prayers designated for a layperson. During the blessing, the minister takes two candles that were blessed on the feast of the Presentation and makes a cross in front of the throat, saying "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness." A priest or deacon will then make the sign of the cross.

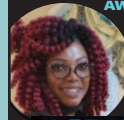

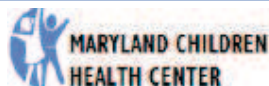
