SUNDAY FEBRUARY 22, 2026 THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

From the Bishop's Pen...

"Jesus fasted for forty days and forty nights and was tempted."

We have started our Lenten journey to empty ourselves of the temptations to focus on ourselves, so that we can be filled with God's love and grace and to have as our only desire, to do His will. Lent, then, is our preparation time to die to temptation and sin in Jesus' crucifixion and death on Good Friday. Then we will be ready to be raised to new life in Christ in His glorious Resurrection on Easter.

Today's Gospel tells us of Jesus' temptations by Satan following His preparation for His public ministry after 40 days and nights of fasting in the desert. Satan first started tempting human beings with Eve in the Garden of Eden. He tempted her to eat from the forbidden tree with the promise that "the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is bad." The god that the Satan speaks of is not our heavenly Father, but himself. Satan considers himself to be a god to be worshiped, and he says exactly that to Jesus in today's Gospel.

After two failed temptations, Satan promises to give the kingdoms of the world to Jesus, if only He would "prostrate yourself and worship me." However, what was Jesus' reply? "Get away, Satan! It is written: 'The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve.'" Jesus did not succumb to Satan's temptations as Adam and Eve did.

Jesus is the strength we need to call upon this Lent to help us transform ourselves from falling to Satan's temptations of doing what he convinces us to do, we want in this life, instead of doing what God wants for us, that is, doing His will to gain everlasting life.

Jesus was tempted three times and resisted all of them. During Jesus' Passion, Peter was tempted to deny Him three times and fell to all of them. In our human weakness, will we always be successful in resisting Satan's temptations? Probably not, so Jesus has given us the Sacrament of Reconciliation to restore in us the ability to resist Satan's temptations. We can then turn back to God and do His will for us. Then we will always have the strength of Jesus to "Seek first the Kingdom of God."

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Our Lord is so humble that he allows us to see him experience temptation. The vulnerability of this moment is awesome to behold. Let us learn from Jesus' interaction with the devil, and be transformed by it. Let us say, with him: "Get away, Satan."

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Take Up Our Cross

Question:

What does Jesus mean when he talks about taking up our cross?

Answer:

Our journey of faith begins in baptism. When we are faithful to it, we find God's plan for us, his way of allowing us to participate in his saving work, which in turn becomes for us our own salvation. Stated simply, we share in the mission of Jesus each day. We live our life with all of its ups, downs, joys, and sorrows in union with the mission of Jesus. Our work then is holy. It is joined to the cross, God's will for Jesus — the way in which he destroys sin and death and makes eternal life possible. His sacrifice accomplishes what we ourselves cannot do.

To take up the cross, then, means that we share in the mission of Jesus and so embrace the sufferings of the cross. It is our daily life made holy, given a redemptive mission. It is our purpose and goal to unite our life to that of Christ. St. Paul says it best, "If we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection" (Rom 6:5).

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED!

Stations of the Cross

Question:

Who invented the Stations of the Cross?

Answer:

The first Stations of the Cross were walked by Jesus himself on the way to Calvary. Known as the "Via Dolorosa" ("The Way of Suffering") or the "Via Crucis" ("The Way of the Cross"), it was marked out from the earliest times and was a traditional walk for pilgrims who came to Jerusalem. The early Christians in Jerusalem would walk the same pathway that Jesus walked, pausing for reflection and prayer. Later, when Christians could not travel to the Holy Land, artistic depictions of "The Way of the Cross" were set up in churches, or outside and Christians would walk from station to station, reading the Gospel account of the Passion, or simply praying and reflecting on each event. While the content or place of each station had changed, the intention was to make a mini-pilgrimage and follow--literally--in the footsteps of Jesus.

This devotion became better known in the Middle Ages, and the Franciscans are credited with its spread. Lent is a time when many people make the Stations and some churches present Passion plays or Living Stations. But anyone can pray the Stations at any time. It is a simple and personal reflection on the passion of Jesus and what it means to us.

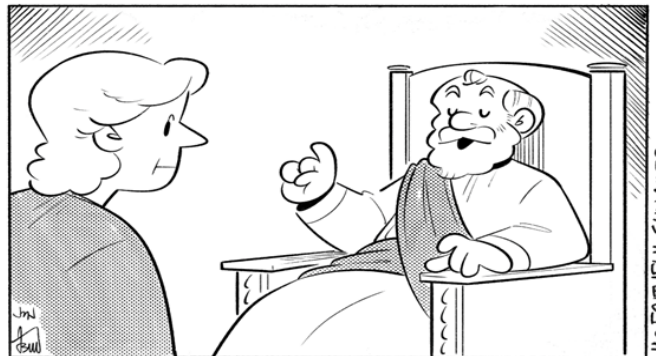
