

# A message from our Pastor...

This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.

#### My dear friends:

In the second reading today from the Book of Revelation, God promises to make all things new: The one who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new." "I am making the whole of creation new." What a promise. How are we expected to live in a new order that God brought about by the raising of Jesus from the dead?

We find this answer in the gospel today. "Love one another." It is here that Jesus, in His farewell discourse at the Last Supper, lays down the principles that will guide us to live the new world order. The word "another" does not refer only to the Disciples of Christ, but it is an all encompassing irrespective of religious inclination, race, or background.

The love that Christ talks about is an identification mark. He says: "...by this love everyone will know that you are my disciples." The early Christian community lived this very well and attracted many converts. In the third century Tertullian noted in his work, Apology [39.7] "see how they love one another." Love is what defines a true disciple of Christ. The love of Christians for one another should be the distinguishing mark of the newness of life that Christ brings to his people by which the world recognizes us as followers of Jesus.

What is new about this commandment of Jesus to love one another? In the past other prophets spoke about love, but it was always in the context of family or the community of the person. Jesus extends it to all people. As Catholics, our knowledge of the Catechism must be centered within a relationship with Jesus and one another.

Jesus' teaching is consistent. It completes everything he has taught that loving each other is much more demanding. It is the test by which you and I will be judged by the world around us. Such a love makes us more credible, more effective instruments of God's transforming action that brings about a new heaven and a new earth that John speaks about in the Book of Revelation, wiping away all tears and removing pain from our midst. If we are credible witnesses, others will want to follow Jesus. If we truly love one another, then we will be able to encourage others to join us on our journey in this life to heaven.

NEW JERSEY SAFE HAVEN LAW - Under the New Jersey Safe Haven Infant Protection Act a person may give up an unwanted infant anonymously. The purpose of Safe Haven is to protect unwanted babies from being hurt or killed from unsafe abandonment. A distressed parent who is unable to care for an infant can give up custody of a baby less than 30 days old safely, legally and anonymously. All that is required is that the baby be brought to any hospital emergency room, police station, fire station, ambulance, first aid, and rescue squads in New Jersey that are staffed 24/7. As long as the child shows no signs of intentional abuse, no name or other information is required. The parent can call the Safe Haven Hotline - 1-877-839-2339 - and get the address and directions for any hospital emergency room, police station, fire station, ambulance, first aid, and rescue squad in the state.







**Saint James School** participated in the ACRE assessment program. We are so proud to be part of the Catholic School system and of our eighth grade students, and we will continue to make the religious and theological preparation of our students a priority.

What is the ACRE? Since the late 1970's NCEA has offered assessment instruments designed to strengthen catechetical/religious education programs. The ACRE (Assessment of Children/Youth Religious Education) helps schools, parishes and diocesan leaders evaluate the faith knowledge and attitudes of students in Catholic schools. As an integrated assessment tool, ACRE provides faith knowledge questions (cognitive domain) and questions related to religious beliefs, attitudes, practices, and perceptions (affective domain). This tool provides national scores for comparison and processes for tracking religious education program data over time.

The spring is always a special time for Mrs. Elaine Comer's and Ms. Jean Feely's second graders! Most recently, and on a beautifully

children celebrated their First Holy Communion. A few days later, they led the school in crowning the Blessed Mother and praying a decade of the Rosary. The students were so very proud to lead this prayer service!

In social studies, the second graders have spent the year working through but very much beyond their textbooks, studying topics such as Native Americans, world landmarks, US presidents, and other countries' cultures.



In science, the children focused on weather, including cloud types and the water cycle. Most recently, the students have been studying plants. During a recent lab, students collected examples of fibrous and tap roots found around the school campus. They observed and sketched the roots before examining a cross

section of one under a microscope. The students also participated in a project-based learning seminar, via Zoom, where they joined students from across the country to learn about rain gardens! After, students planted a variety of seeds, using recycled materials as planters.
