

## A message from our Pastor...

My dear friends:

In Matthew's Gospel following the Beatitudes, Jesus calls the disciples salt of the earth and light of the world. At first sight this juxtaposition might be surprising. The Beatitudes insist on the inner disposition of the disciples, 'poor in spirit', 'meek', 'merciful', 'clean of heart'. Now, Jesus invites them to become aware of their dignity and of the responsibility entrusted to them. (Matt 5:13-16).

After closer inspection, these two texts are far from being in opposition. They are intentionally connected in God's plan. Those whom Jesus declares blessed already possess the kingdom and they must make it shine upon the world according to what they are and what they do.

Salt of the earth has two meanings:

Salt is a symbol of wisdom or of the spiritual sacrifice. In the second case, the emphasis is on the possible loss of flavor of the salt, this alluding to what happens to those disciples who would not be courageous enough to pursue their Christian commitment to the end (1Cor. 1:18-25).

The Sacred Scriptures record several uses of salt. It is used to flavor food (Job 6:6). It is used to purify person, sacrifices, lands taken from enemies (Ex 30:35, Ex. 16:4, Judg. 3:45). When shared, it is the sign of friendship (Lev 2:13).

It is impossible to be sure which one of these meanings is intended here. Because salt can lose its natural properties we are led to the work of the disciples in the world i.e., evangelical wisdom. Having received God's Word revealed by Jesus, they must share with all the divine wisdom, of which they are the bearers. If they fail to do this, they will surely be despised and finally thrown out.

Light of the World -- Community:

To share one's bread with the hungry, to give water to the thirsty, to shelter the homeless, to clothe the naked, to visit the sick and imprisoned, to bury the dead, these are the concrete demands placed upon the chosen people of God whom the covenant had freed from slavery (Ex 4:22). In the community according to God's heart, even a menacing gesture or a hurtful word is avoided and no one is hungry or in need.

Such a community will shine with God's glory. The lives of its people will be a testimony, in action, to God whom it claims for its protector, whose name it bears, for He is light and justice. This type of community has in itself a prophetic function. It denounces the ways of a world dominated by a competitive spirit with its accompanying injustices, egotisms, and subjection of the weak to the strong. It announces instead the ideal of a loving and just world shown to be both possible and precious. One Christian holding high his or her lamp may encourage other to place their lamps on stands.


The responsibility of Christians called to be salt of the earth and light of the world is incumbent upon us. By our behavior we will be light to the world. Now, more than ever "Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father" (Matt 5:16).

We must act in such a way that, by seeing the good done by the community, people may give thanks to Father in heaven. Neither the glory of the community nor that of the church is sought, but always and solely that of God. "The measure of a Christian is not in the height of his grasp but in the depth of his love" Clarence Jordan

**St. James School News****Grade 4**


Miss Heather Leyhan's and Miss Lila Greenstone's fourth graders are enjoying a very busy and successful year! This year in social studies they are exploring history through a "New Jersey" perspective. Each student was assigned a different NJ county to research for their county projects. They learned about the regions of NJ, Native Americans, and have just begun to explore New Jersey's role in the American Revolution.

Plants and animals were a popular science unit for the students. In addition to learning all about animals both classes welcomed class pets for which to care. The students practice the virtue of responsibility by ensuring the pets are fed and cages are kept cleaned. Miss Leyhan's class is home to Hershey the hamster and Miss Greenstone's class to pet mice Nugget, Pianissimo, Skittles, and Scribbles.

The fourth grade loves to read! Miss Greenstone's class has read the novels *Bless this Mouse* and *Escape from Mr. Lemoncello's Library* and have begun reading *The Magician's Nephew* next month. Miss Leyhan's class has read *Because of Winn Dixie* and *Bunnicula* and have started *"Toliver's Secret."*



Miss Greenstone's class completed their first project-based learning in October. Students were divided into groups and tasked with creating a section of a church. The sections were put together to create a "mouse-sized" church. Miss Leyhan's class researched the heights of various buildings and monuments around the world, made a poster using paper clips to model the heights of the buildings and monuments. In December, the students studied animal habitats and became zookeepers, building habitats for various animals.


