





CRUSADER ATHLETICS UPDATE

Middle School Football: Coach Hegedusich

This past Thursday, the MS boys football team competed against Hill Country Christian and made history: it was the first time a MS game had been played "under the lights"! The boys played tough, but came up short with a score of 7-19. Henry Watson played a great game (his first tackle football game), scoring the team's only touchdown and making several key defensive tackles. We still have a

lot of work to be done as the season progresses. We have a bye week this week to fine tune a few things, and our next game will be at home on October 8th against FEAST at 7:00 p.m.

Upper School Varsity Football: Coach Vidal

This past Saturday, the team traveled to McDade, Texas to play the Bulldogs. This was our season opener, and the boys played a tough game and good game overall. This game taught us a lot about ourselves and how to handle adversity. The game opened with a long touchdown run by McDade on their first play, and on the next play for kickoff return, Michael Cantu ran it all the way back for his first varsity touchdown. The team came up short with a score of 27-52. We had big games by both of our seniors: David Henriquez caught a 50-yard touchdown pass from Mick Skeens and at the end of the game, had 13 total defensive tackles and a fumble recovery. Nicholas Cosnowski ran for 84 yards on 15 carries and scored a touchdown and a 1 point conversion. Our freshman group stepped up with Mick Skeens throwing for 111 yards on 7 attempts and one touchdown. Mason Wendtland led all freshman with 13 tackles, five solo. We look forward to hosting New Braunfel's Calvary Baptist on Friday on Crusader Field at 7:30 p.m.

For their "last first" Crusader football game of the season, seniors David Henriquez and Nick Cosnowski earned the right to be called Big Dawgs! With 12 tackles, 50 receiving yards, his first ever touchdown, and a fumble recovery, David stepped up to lead the pack! Nick had 15 tackles, 87 rushing yards, a forced fumble, and a touchdown! Middle School Volleyball: Coach Alvarado

The girls have played tough during each of the last two matches. With the young team led by just three 8th graders, there is a lot of learning to be done and a lot of growth to be achieved. The girls are responding well to practices and are working hard every day. They look to host Castle Hills in crusader gym today at 4:30 p.m. and then travel to Winston to play on Friday at 4:30 p.m.

Lady Crusader Varsity Volleyball: Coach Alvarez

The team is on fire right now, having opened the season and won seven straight games. Right now, our girls volleyball team still has the best record in all of TAPPS 1A schools that field a volleyball team. Coach Alvarez is doing a great job leading the girls into the right direction. The team traveled to Fredericksburg Heritage this past Tuesday to play the 2019 District Champs. The game was decided in four sets with the Lady Crusaders coming out on top with a 3-1 victory. The Lady Crusader Volleyball team is exciting to watch, and we encourage everyone to come out and support the girls in their next home game vs. Gateway Christian at 6:30 p.m. today. Middle School Cross Country: Coach Buendia and Upper School Cross Country: Coach Gray

The Atonement Academy's middle and high school cross country teams were excited to compete in their second race of the season hosted by FEAST homeschool. They were also very grateful for the overcast weather that made for great running conditions. The middle school team was led by 6th grader Zachary Cantu who came in 4th in his 2-mile race with a time of 12:58. Also having a good race was Adrian Garcia-Tovar who came in a time of 16:24, running a full 40

seconds faster than his previous race this season. The high school was thrilled to welcome Madison Vale, Madelline Magallanes, and Xavier Magallanes to their first race of the season. All three put up good times and look forward to running even faster at their next meet on October 10th in Austin at the Brentwood Christian School Bears Invitational.

This week there is no Cross Country meet for both teams, as they look to race on campus this Saturday with a course that has been marked by our cross country coaches. We will be looking to host a XC meet next year for schools to attend.

COLLEGE COUNSELING NEWS

Class of 2021

Today, the first of October, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opens their application system. Regardless of your income, all families should complete the FAFSA every year, each year they plan to have a child attend college. The FAFSA is required in order to be eligible for all federal financial aid, as well as most state and institution aid. Families have from October 1st to June 30th each year to submit their FAFSA. Funds are allocated on a first-come, first-serve basis, so the sooner you apply, the more aid you may receive.

This link will take you to a page for how to begin and sign up for FAFSA. You will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR) within three weeks of completing your FAFSA. The SAR is a summary of your aid eligibility and includes your Expected Family Contribution (EFC). Schools use this number to calculate your child's financial aid package.

Looking for Scholarships

Begin applying for scholarships within the college or university in which you are submitting applications. Be sure to look for deadlines. Also, visit Tuition Funding Sources (TFS) at https://www.tuitionfundingsources.com/ for more scholarship opportunities.

The SAT

SAT day at The Atonement Academy is October 14th. There will be no classes (remote or in-person) for seniors that day.

Class of 2022

Begin looking at colleges and universities virtually. Look at our fall college fairs and visits on our school's website. Begin making a list of colleges you are interested in and researching their degree programs along with cost.

After taking the PSAT, The Atonement Academy encourages all juniors to sign up for the SAT in March. The March SAT date is March 13th, with a registration deadline of February 12th. Due to the pandemic and the lack of testing availability, Texas A&M University has announced they are extending their test-optional admissions policy to the Class of 2022. We await announcements from other colleges and universities

I began attending The Atonement Academy in 2007 as a 6th grader. It was a tough transition as I found the curriculum to be much more challenging than I was accustomed to. I attended The Atonement for seven years (Middle School and Upper School) and graduated in 2014. While at the Academy, I also completed two years in the Pre-Freshman Engineering summer program through UTSA. Then after my sophomore year in the Upper School, I began taking college classes at

Northwest Vista College. I haven't had a summer off since 7th grade!

My goal in Upper School was to take the pilgrimage trip to Rome with my classmates in 2013. I started working at Bill Miller's BBQ my junior year to save money. With the help of my family and a generous grant from The Atonement Academy, I was able to see the wonders of Italy! My favorite memory was sitting on a balcony in Assisi in the company of my classmates.

When I look back on my years at the Academy, I am most grateful for the strong academic requirements that prepared me to be more mature and take my studies in undergraduate and graduate school seriously. I also appreciate my strong faith that has helped me to find peace during difficult times.

By the time I graduated from the Upper School, I had over 45 hours of college credit from my summer classes and AP coursework. I enrolled at UTSA in 2014 and completed my Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology – Athletic Medicine in 2017. All this time I continued to work weekends at Bill Miller's BBQ to help with

my books and expenses.

My goal since Middle School was to gain acceptance to a Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program so that I could achieve my dream of becoming a physical therapist. I was in the process of re-taking some prerequisite courses to improve my GPA when I was accepted to the University of the Incarnate Word's physical therapy program in June of 2014.

I started the program in the fall of 2014, and right away I was grateful for my three years of Latin at the Academy. My human anatomy class was no joke! Honestly, graduate school was so tough, I hardly had time to do anything but study.

The DPT program gave me multiple opportunities to participate in clinical rotations at Methodist Health Care Ministries Outpatient Clinic (providing pro bono care to the low income community), Warm Spring's Outpatient Neurologic Clinic, Christus Santa Rosa Hospital Acute Care Services, and Baptist Hospital Acute Rehabilitation Services. My favorite setting was Acute Rehabilitation and I hope to work in that field once I am a licensed practitioner.

I completed my DPT requirements this August and I am currently studying to take the board exam in October. I would appreciate everyone's prayers because this test is the last challenge that I must overcome to achieve my dreams.

Once this is over, I hope to become a licensed physical therapist here in San Antonio so that I can continue to serve my community's health care needs. I am also looking forward to finally having some free time to enjoy hiking and camping with my friends.







THE KING'S FAIR 2020




Note that the date has changed, and there is no half-day just before King's Fair, but there will be plenty of fun, food, and fellowship! Mark your calendars, and plan your costume!
