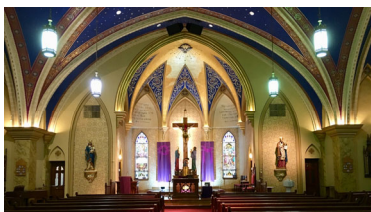

Abstinence from meat is required on all Fridays of Lent for Catholics 14 years of age and older. Good Friday will also be a day of fasting. It is required for all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59, to eat only one full meal on these days, and other foods as necessary to maintain their strength.

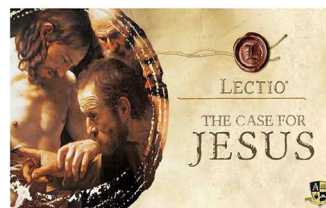

Soul Info:

St. Paul had one of the most dramatic conversions in Christianity. Paul was once a ferocious opponent of Christianity named 'Saul.' He was a well-educated Jew who saw this new "Way" of Christianity to be a threat to the faith of the chosen people of the Old Testament. It is said that he helped kill St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr.

After a blinding encounter with God, a voice spoke to Saul saying, "Why are you persecuting me?" In their conversation, Jesus revealed to Saul his great need for mercy. Saul was healed and transformed into "Paul" who was a zealous apostle for the rest of his life. Paul wrote letters back to the communities he converted to Christianity, which have become much of the New Testament in the Bible. His writings are often the second reading at Sunday Mass.

Most Catholics do not have as dramatic of a conversion story as St. Paul, but some do. Some people's conversion happens slowly, step by step through different phases of life as Our Lord draws them closer to Him through His love and mercy. Either way, listen for God's call to you, and respond with all your heart.

Fun Facts:

- At the 2018 population count, 23% of Americans identified as Catholic, the second largest religious group after the combined Protestant denominations. In the 2020 Gallup Poll, 25% of Americans said they were Catholic. In numbers, American Catholics have increased from 45 million in 1960 to 72 million in 2018.

Take Action:

- Read about Saul's conversion in the Acts of the Apostles 9:1-22 in the Bible. Take time in prayer today to thank God for all the times he has drawn you closer to him. Ask Him to show you the way to respond more strongly to His call to be His disciple. Listen and respond, so He doesn't have to knock you down to get your attention like he did for Saul.

LET'S CELEBRATE OUR CATECHUMENS AND CANDIDATES OF RCIA THE RITES OF SENDING AND ELECTION

On this First Sunday of Lent, we are proud to welcome members of our RCIA to the Rite of Sending and the Rite of Election at the 9 a.m. mass at St. Patrick Church.

The Rite of Sending is the parish celebration that sends catechumens and candidates to the cathedral for the Rite of Election. (This year, due to pandemic cautions, both rites are allowed to be held at the parish.)

The Rite of Sending offers the parish community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress the catechumens and candidates have made. We express approval of their election or recognition, and send them forth to our bishop with assurance of the parish's care and support. **The Rite of Election** is the recognition of God's choice to call the catechumens for immediate initiation into the church. In Sacred Scripture, the Book of Revelation makes reference to a "Book of Life," in which are written the names of those who have chosen to follow the Lord Jesus and be baptized. Those who are already baptized, as Catholics or in other denominations, had our names written in the Book of Life at our Baptism. In the Rite of Election, those preparing for Baptism are invited to come forward and sign a book, which we call the "Book of the Elect," as a sign of their desire to be numbered among the chosen of God.

These Rites mark a key moment. For the catechumens and candidates, the Rites signify they have been called by Christ, and the community unifies and helps bring those in RCIA to the fullness of life in the Church. For the catechumen the Rites also signify that the judgment and decision-making about whether to enter the Catholic Church has ended. From this point forward, they are no longer catechumens but are called the "elect."

Congratulations to Maggie and Steve who will be fully initiated into the Church at the Easter Vigil!

Moses spoke to the people, saying: "The priest shall receive the basket from you and shall set it in front of the altar of the Lord, your God. Then you shall declare before the Lord, your God, 'My father was a wandering Aramean who went down to Egypt with a small household and lived there as an alien. 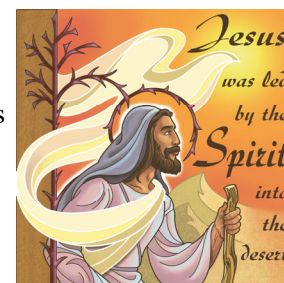

Brothers and sisters: What does Scripture say? The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart- that is, the word of faith that we preach-, for if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. For the Scripture says, No one who believes in him will be put to shame. For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all, enriching all who call upon him. For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Jesus said to him in reply, "It is written: You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve." Then he led him to Jerusalem, made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written: He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you, and: With their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." 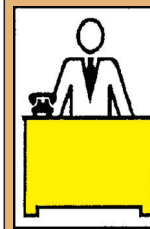
