#### **BAPTISM**

The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the first Sunday of the month after Mass (except during Lent). Parents must contact the parish office in advance; first-time parents are required to attend a baptism formation session.

### SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholics who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish office.

#### ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the parish office for more information about the OCIA.

#### PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Please call the parish office to arrange for a pastoral visit, Anointing of the Sick, and/or Holy Communion for those who are ill or elderly and unable to come to church.

#### **MARRIAGES**

Arrangements should be made one year in advance of the wedding. Please contact the parish office before booking a reception venue. Once a wedding date is confirmed, a priest or deacon will assist with the required marriage preparation process.

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

On the Fifth Sunday in Lent, we hear the amazing account of Jesus raising His friend Lazarus from the dead. This is the last of the sequence of three readings from the Gospel of John that are traditionally read as part of the preparation for adults who will be baptized at Easter. What all three passages have in common is that each tells the story of a person who faced a seemingly insurmountable burden, but through an encounter with Jesus, received healing and the grace to begin living a new life, set free from what had bound them.

In the case of Lazarus, this was literally true: He was dead, bound with burial cloths, and in the tomb. If ever there was a hopeless situation, this was it. Jesus wept over His friend, and He wept with compassion for His friends who were mourning their loss. Death grieves Jesus for the same reason it grieves us; because it's not supposed to be this way. We were made to live. Jesus, in His humanity, was able to experience the weight of this grief, the sorrow that accompanies death. But what set Him apart was that, in His divinity, He had the power to do something about it. His words ring out: "Roll away the stone... Untie him and let him go!"

The Gospels these past three Sundays have challenged us to identify the areas of our lives where we stand in radical need of healing and renewal. How are we, like the Samaritan woman, seeking fulfillment where it can't be found? How are we blinded from reality by our addiction to sin? And finally, how are we spiritually dead, distant from the Lord of life in a way that, on our own, we cannot overcome?

We are invited now, in these last days of Lent, to submit all of this to God, trusting in His merciful love that is more powerful even than death. We are called to believe that, through our Baptism into the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, we have a claim on the life that only He can give. May we allow Him to roll away the stone, untie us and let us go, so that we may live to give Him praise and glory and to welcome others into this saving encounter.

### The Fifth Sunday of Lent

### First Reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

God says not to remember the events from long ago, but to focus on the things he plans to do next. He also claims he will again help his chosen people when they need him.

### Second Reading: Philippians 3:8-14

Paul describes knowledge of Jesus as more important than knowledge of the Old Law. He wishes to share in the power of Jesus' resurrection, and speaks of concentrating on the finish line of the race with salvation as the prize to be won.

#### Gospel: John 8:1-11

Jesus preached forgiveness of sin, but in the old law those accused of adultery were to be stoned. So the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus and brought a woman accused of adultery to him, asking him what he would do to her. Jesus asked that one without sin cast the first stone, and then all of the elders left. Jesus told the woman that he did not condemn her, but warned her to avoid such sin in the future.



### 2025 Lenten Obligations

- 1) The days of both fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday (March 5) and Good Friday (April 18).
- 2) The other Fridays of Lent (Mar. 7, 14, 21, 28; April 4, and 11) are days of abstinence.
- **3)** Fasting in the Roman Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal with two smaller meals which together do not equal the size of your full meal. The obligation of fasting applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.
- **4)** Abstinence in the Roman Catholic tradition means to abstain from eating meat (beef, chicken, pork, turkey, etc.).
- 5) Abstinence applies to all Catholics aged 14 and up.
