BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the first Sunday of the month after Mass (except during Lent). Parents must contact the parish office in advance; first-time parents are required to attend a baptism formation session.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholics who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish office.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the parish office for more information about the OCIA.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Please call the parish office to arrange for a pastoral visit, Anointing of the Sick, and/or Holy Communion for those who are ill or elderly and unable to come to church.

MARRIAGES

Arrangements should be made one year in advance of the wedding. Please contact the parish office before booking a reception venue. Once a wedding date is confirmed, a priest or deacon will assist with the required marriage preparation process.

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

This weekend we observe the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. The observance of this feast in New Jersey was transferred from its traditional Thursday, forty days after the Resurrection, to Sunday during the Covid pandemic. That move has been made permanent by the bishops of New Jersey, with the hope that it will facilitate participation in this feast day by more of the faithful. It is worth noting, especially for travelers and commuters, that while most of the United States observes the Ascension on Sunday, our neighbors in New York and Pennsylvania (as well as all of New England and Nebraska) retain the traditional Thursday observance.

What is the great significance of the Ascension? When Jesus ascended into heaven, He took His body with Him. Yes, it was a glorified, resurrected body, but a human one nonetheless. This was the completion of what began on the day Jesus was conceived in the womb of the Blessed Mother, when He emptied Himself of the glory of divinity to become one with our humanity, a human nature loved by the God who created it, but also in need of healing and redemption. Jesus is fully divine and fully human, one person uniting two natures (theologians call this the Hypostatic Union), so when He returned to the right hand of the Father in heaven, He could not simply shed the human body and leave it behind. So, He brought our humanity, redeemed and glorified, into heaven.

The Ascension of the Lord is a tremendous sign of hope for us. It reminds us of the dignity of our humanity and the value of our body, too often obscured by sin and suffering. It tells us that, by participation in the life of Jesus, we can also be redeemed and glorified, and that there is a place for us in heaven, too. The Collect of the Mass for this feast captures this hope beautifully:

Gladden us with holy joys, almighty God, and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving, for the Ascension of Christ your Son is our exaltation, and, where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

Jesus had appeared many times to his disciples after his resurrection. On this final occasion, Jesus' departing message is that they will soon receive the Holy Spirit to strengthen them in their work. No sooner does he say this, he is taken up to heaven before their eyes.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23

Paul prays that God may grant wisdom and enlightenment to the Ephesians so that they may know the great hope to which they are called. Every power has been given to Christ who now reigns in heaven. He is the "head of the church, which is his body."

Gospel: Luke 24:46-53

Jesus tells His disciples that with His death and resurrection scripture has been fulfilled. As witnesses, when the Holy Spirit comes upon them, they will go out and teach in the name of Jesus, repentance and forgiveness to all nations. Then Jesus led them out, raised His hands and blessed them and was taken into Heaven.


